Stornoway in the Western Isles is the administrative centre for the council region and the main service centre for Lewis and Harris. It has Neolithic and Norse origins. It developed as a fishing port. Today it is an important ferry port. Industries such as fishing, textiles, tweed, black pudding are important.


In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Population change 2011 to 2022






#### **Employment type**

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)




#### Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)




#### Distance travelled to work






