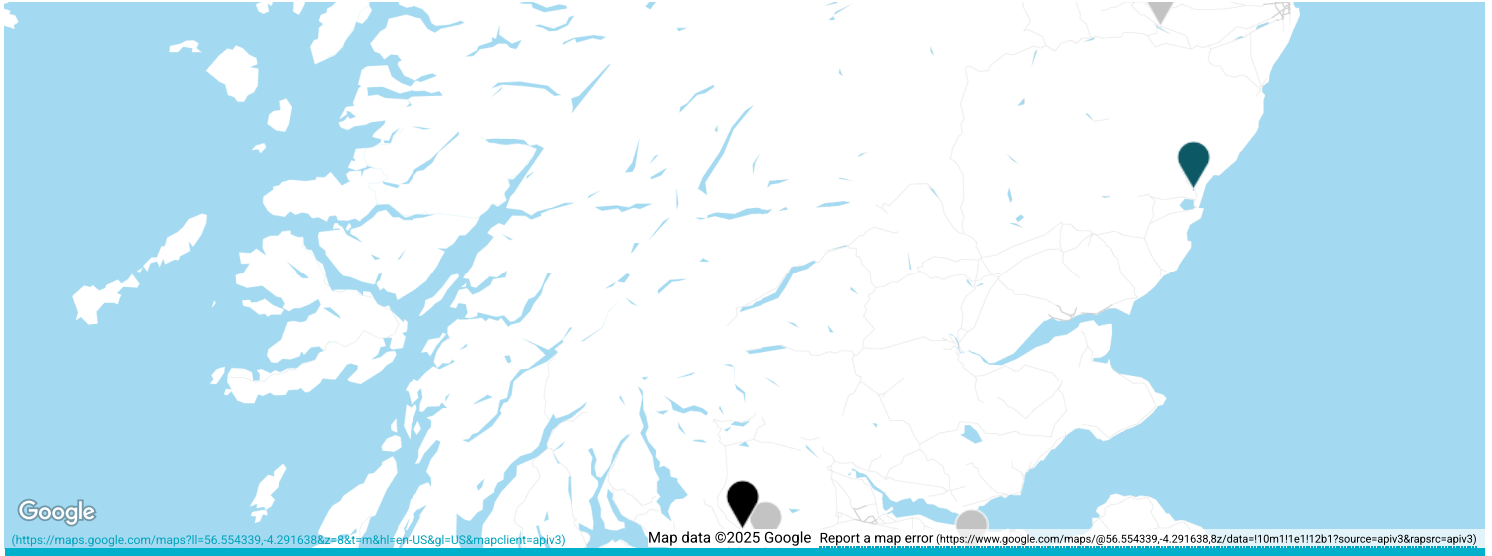




# Strathblane

## STIRLING

POPULATION **1,887**

Strathblane in Stirling Council is a commuter town for Glasgow. Historically the town developed in relation to the calico works and the bleaching fields. The original public housing scheme is now surrounded by new private housing.

In this small town, this population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

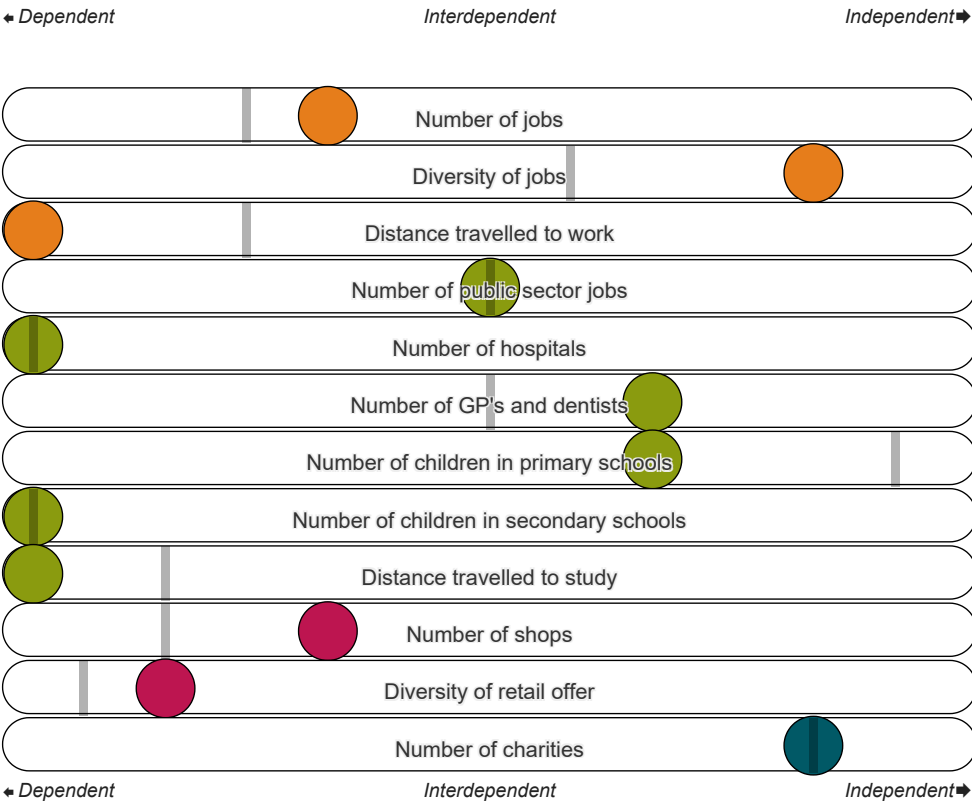
Strathblane is an interdependent to dependent town.

Strathblane is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Strathblane is grouped with 8 other towns. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

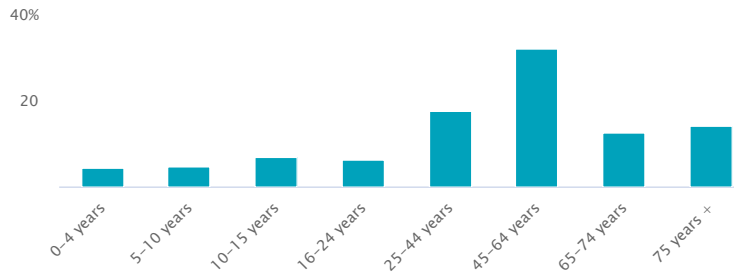

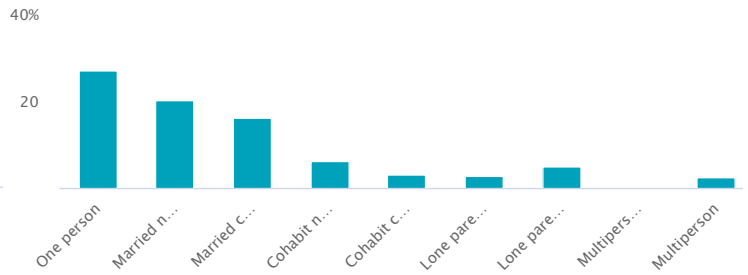

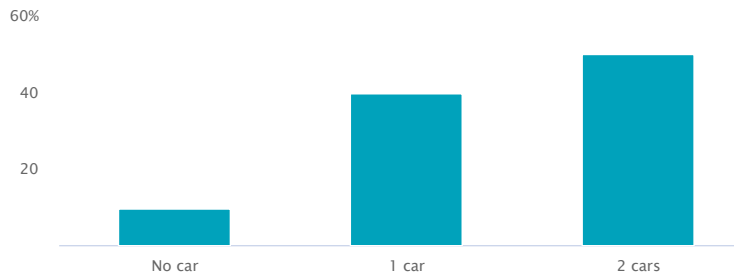

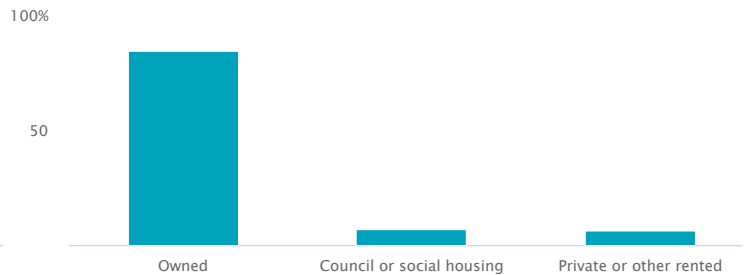

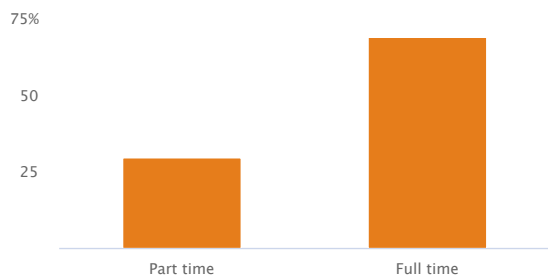

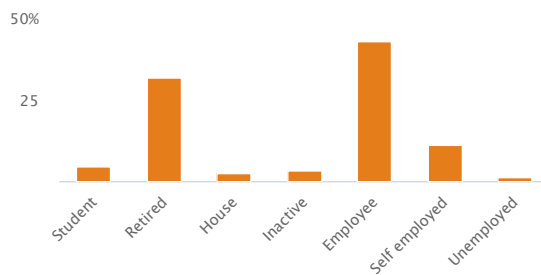
## Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



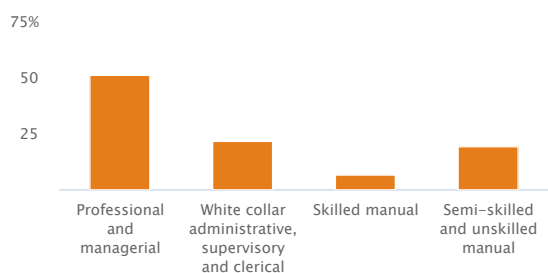
## Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

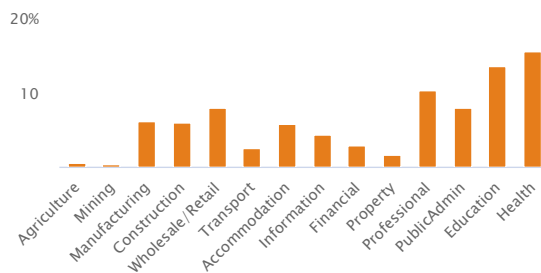


## Social Grade

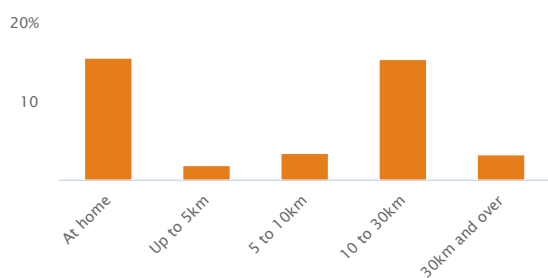
(% households aged 16-64)



## Sector Diversity

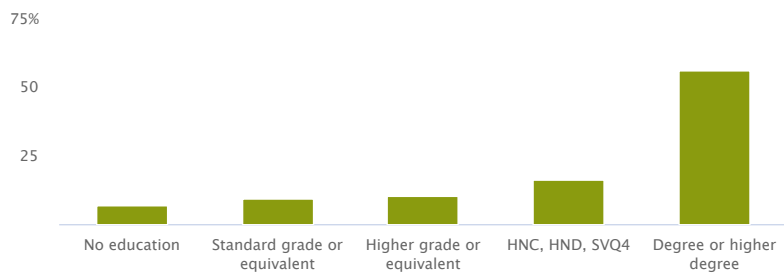


## Distance travelled to work

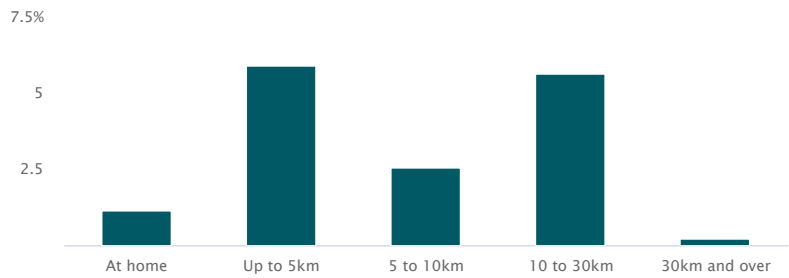
