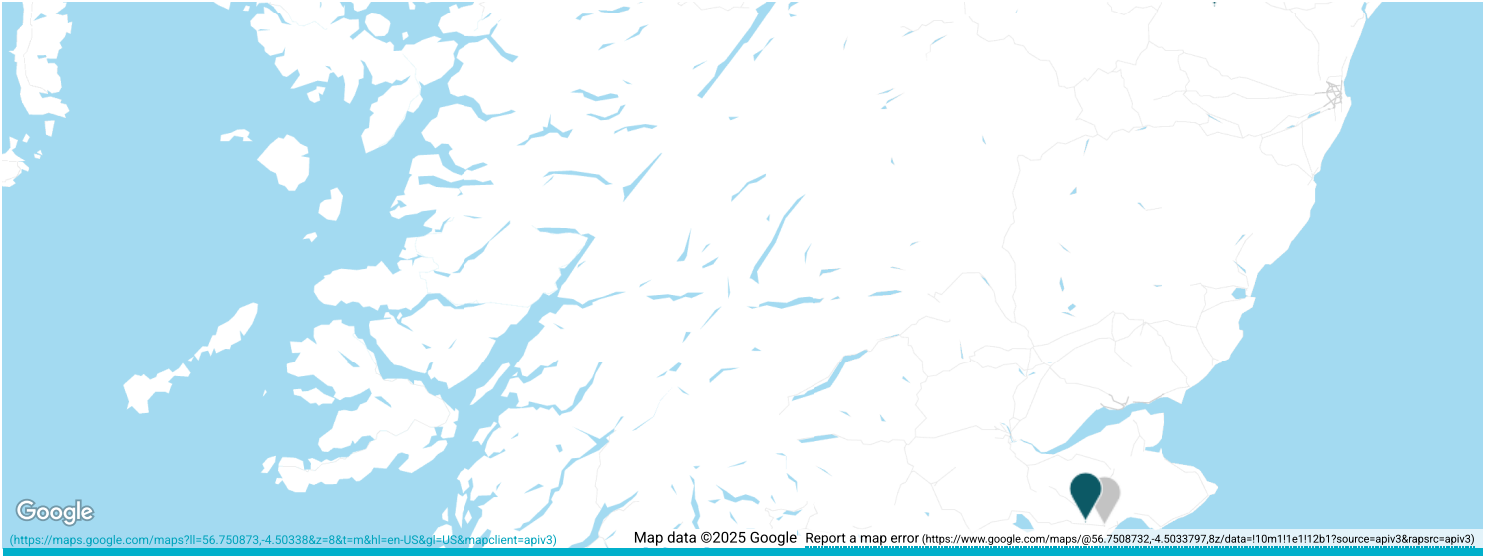




Strathpeffer

Strathpeffer is in Highland. The arrival of the railway saw the town develop as a Victorian spa town. It remains a tourist centre being popular with coach tour operators.

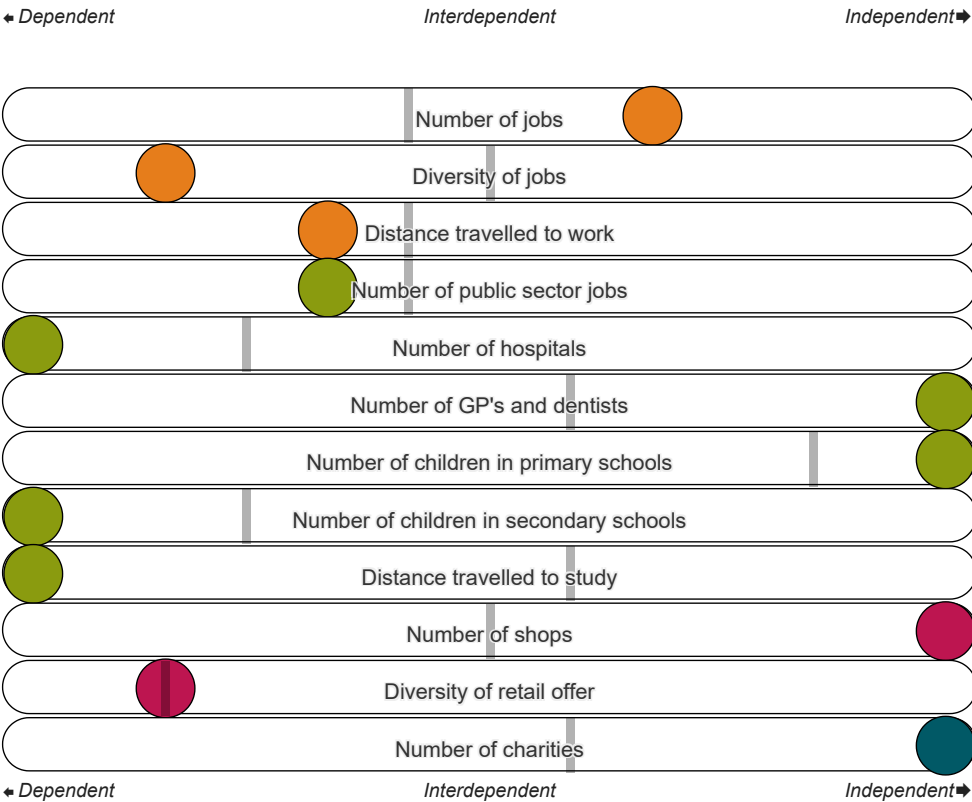
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Strathpeffer is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Strathpeffer is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of children in primary schools, public sector jobs, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, shops, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. Strathpeffer differs most from its group in the number of hospitals; and the distance travelled to study.

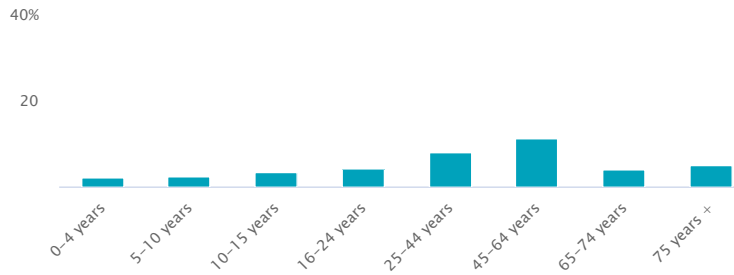

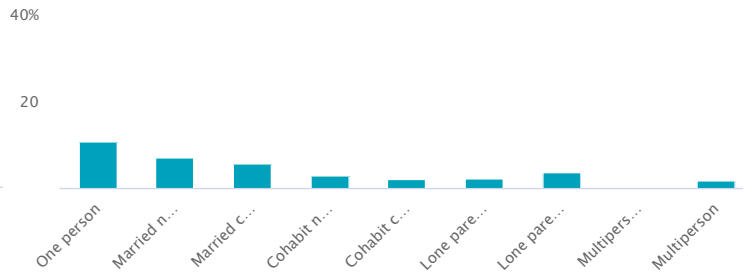

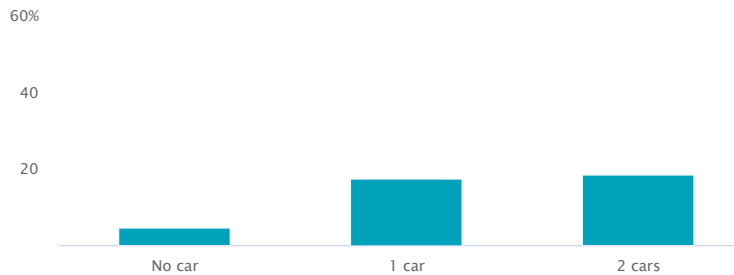

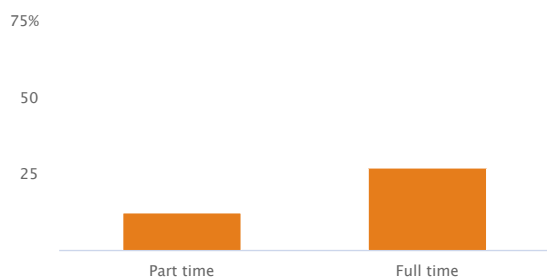

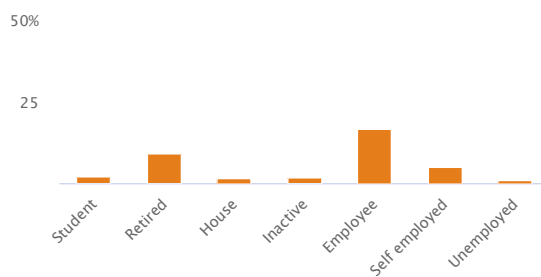
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



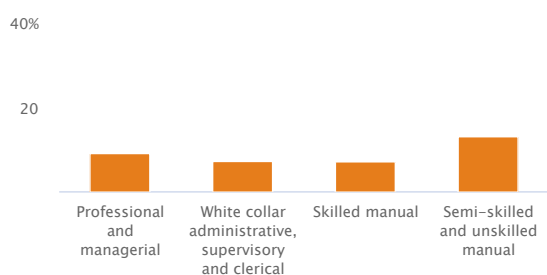
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

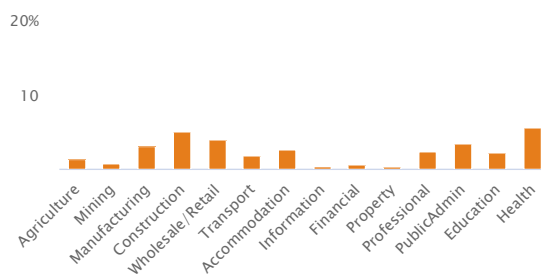

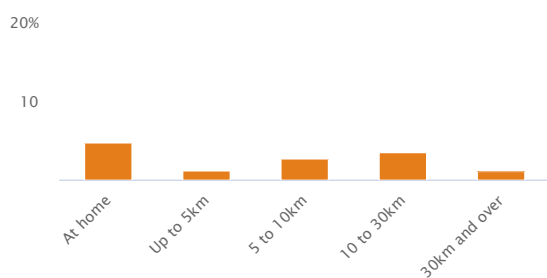
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

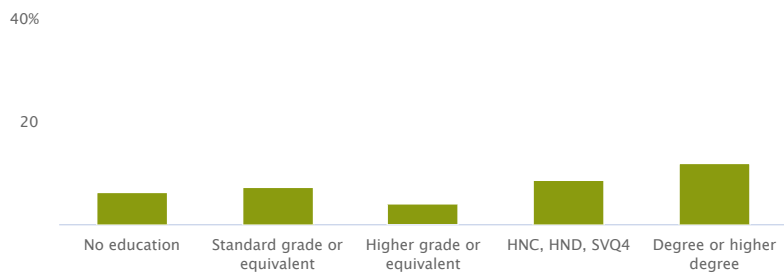


Distance travelled to work

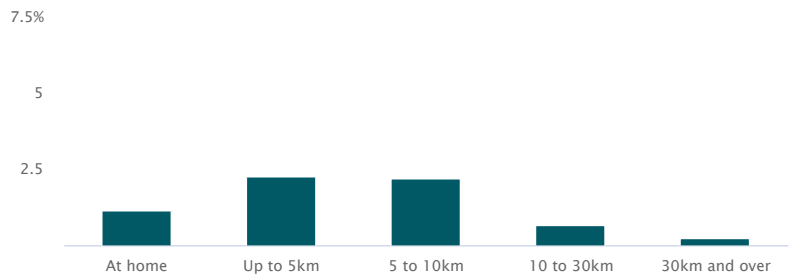
