Tarbert in Argyll and Bute is primarily a port town. Traditionally a herring port the economy of Tarbert remains focussed on fishing with a number of fishing industry and processing companies . It is also still a ferry port for Portavadie bringing tourists to the town.

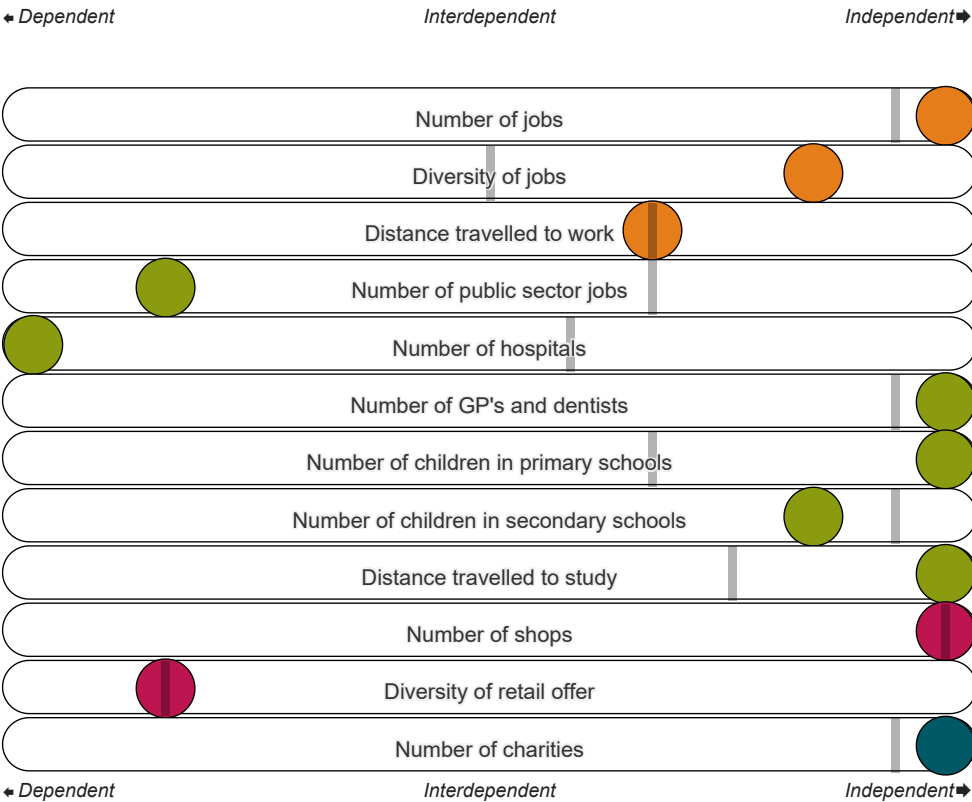
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Tarbert is an independent to interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Aberfeldy](#), [Aberlour](#), [Dornoch](#), and [Grantown-on-Spey](#).

Inter-relationships



Tarbert is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Tarbert is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, and public sector jobs. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. Tarbert differs most from its group in the number of hospitals.

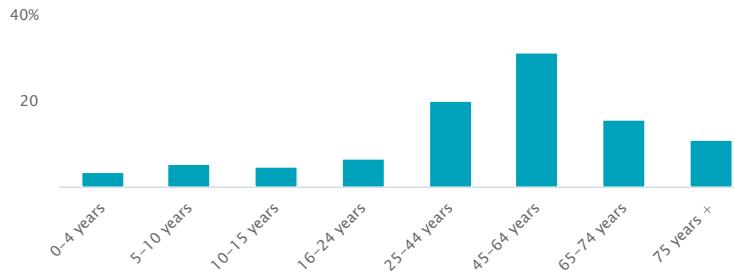

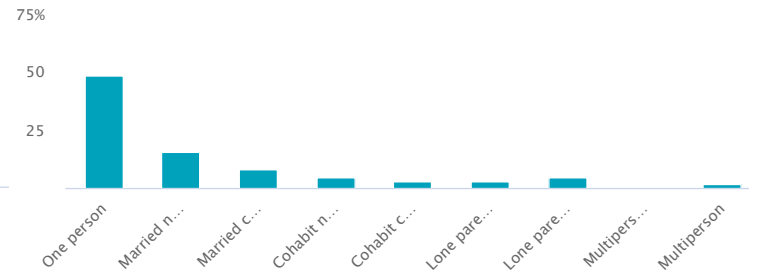

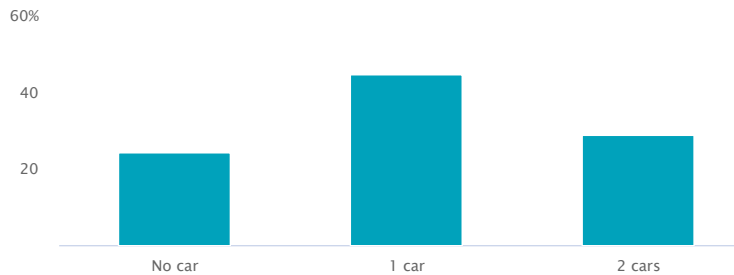

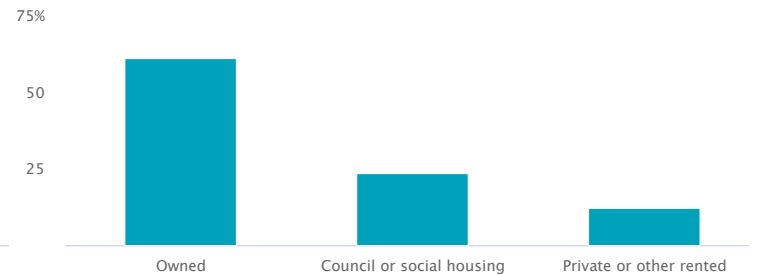
Household composition

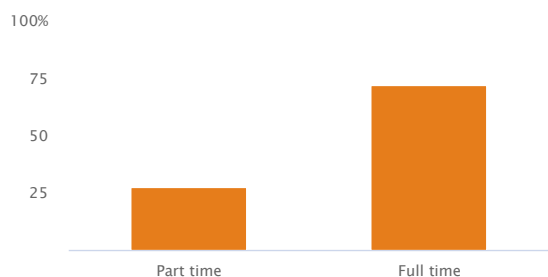

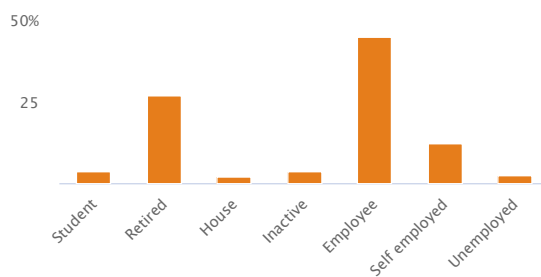
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



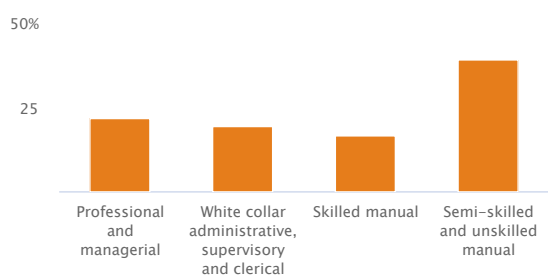
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

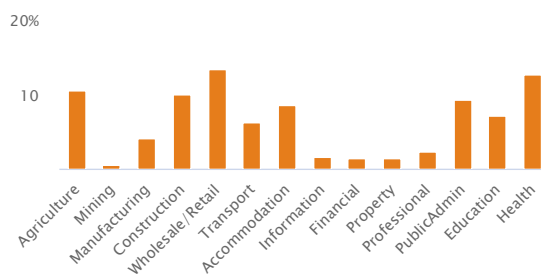

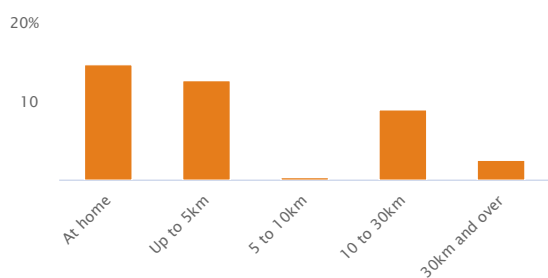
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

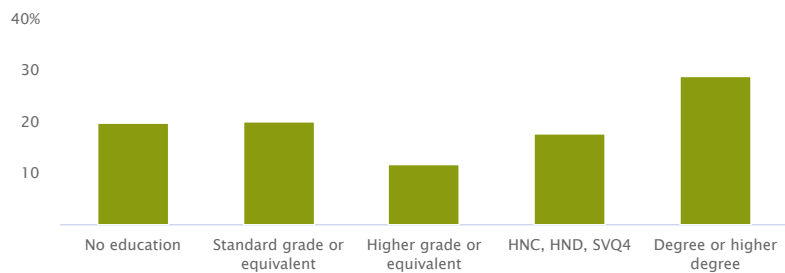


Distance travelled to work

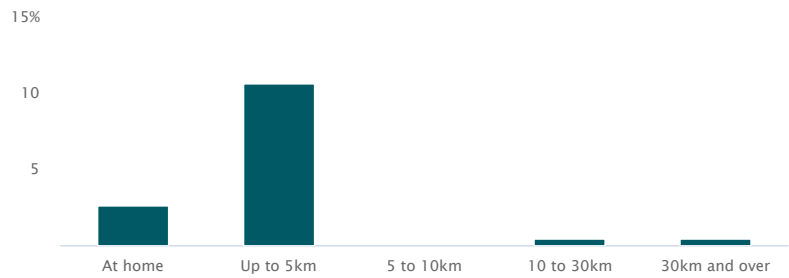
