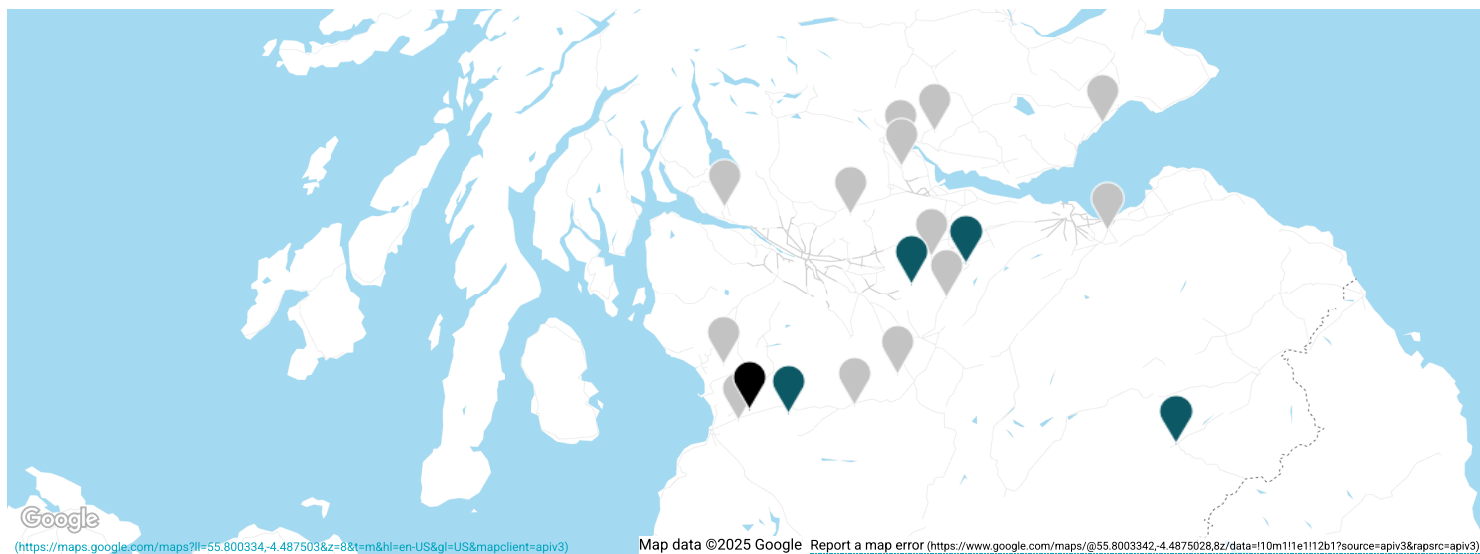




Tarbolton

SOUTH AYRSHIRE

Tarbolton is a burgh in South Ayrshire and housed agricultural workers. It is known for its association with Robert Burns. It grew as mining developed at the Drumley pit in the 19th century. More recent applications for an open cast mine at Tarbolton were rejected on the grounds of amenity and tourism. It acts as a service centre to the agricultural area.

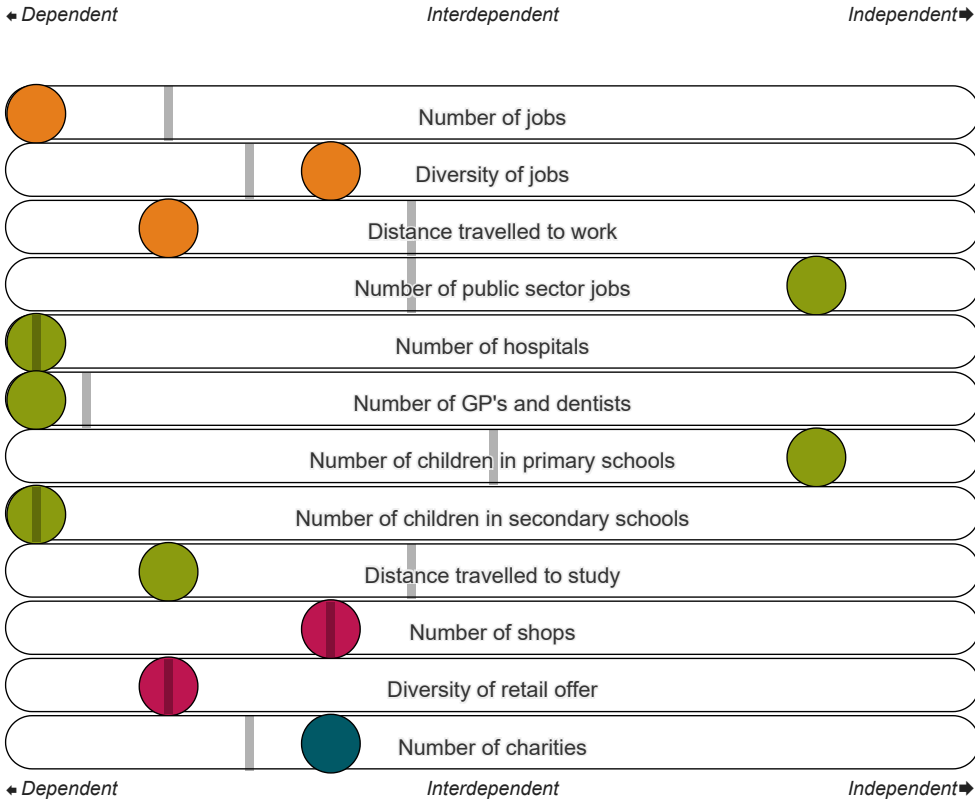
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Tarbolton is a dependent to interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Tarbolton is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Tarbolton is grouped with 17 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, and public sector jobs. Tarbolton differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

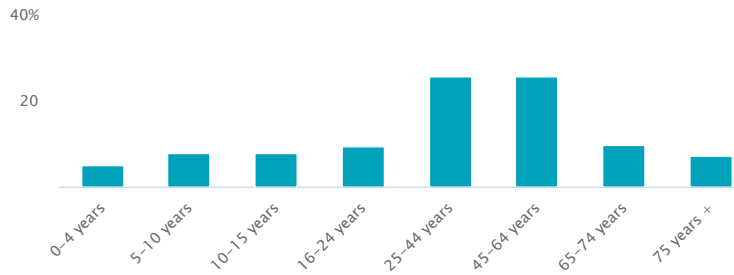

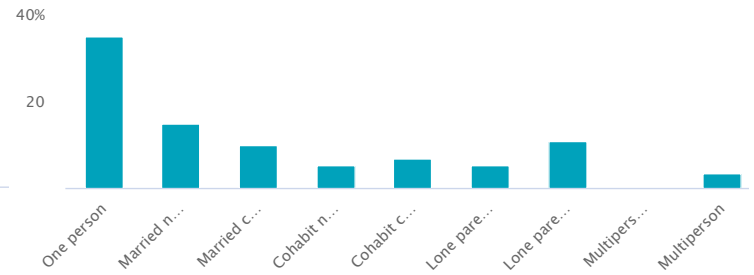

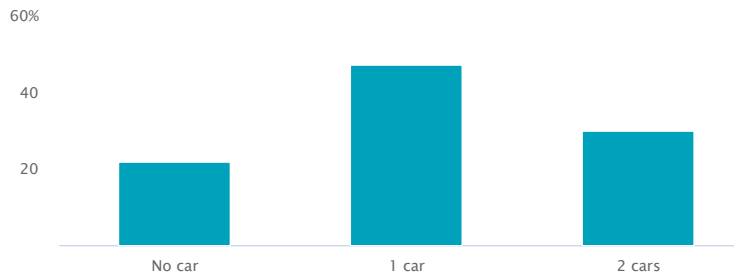

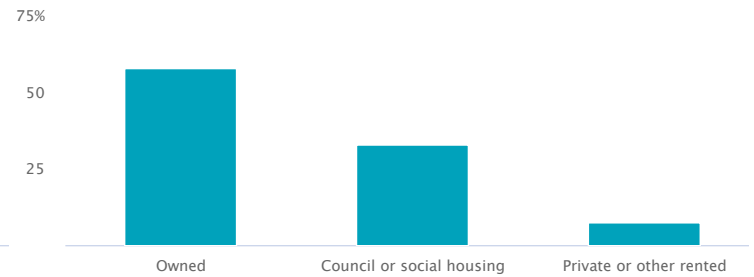

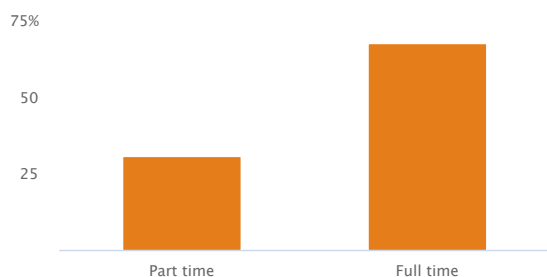

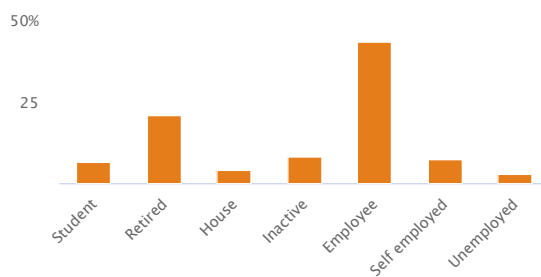
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



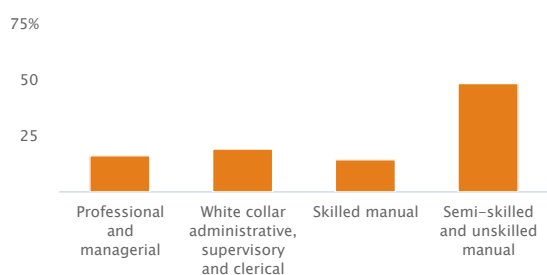
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

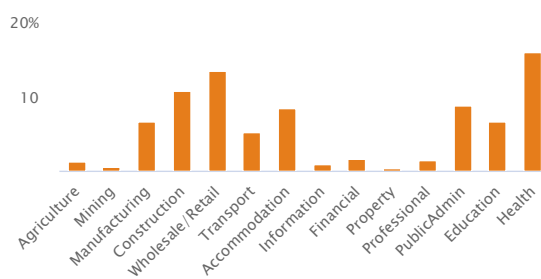


Social Grade

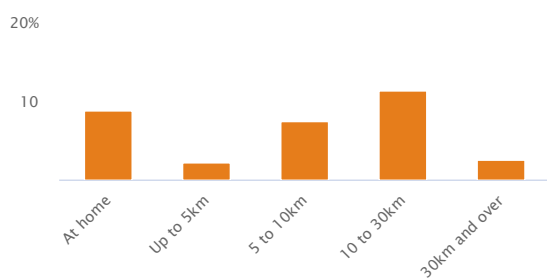
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

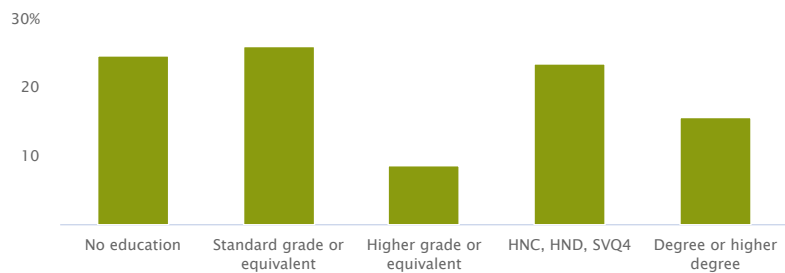


Distance travelled to work

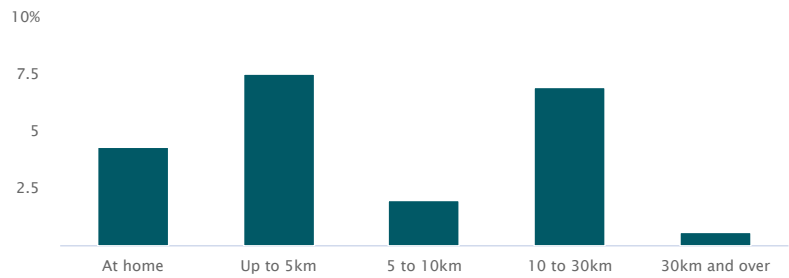
