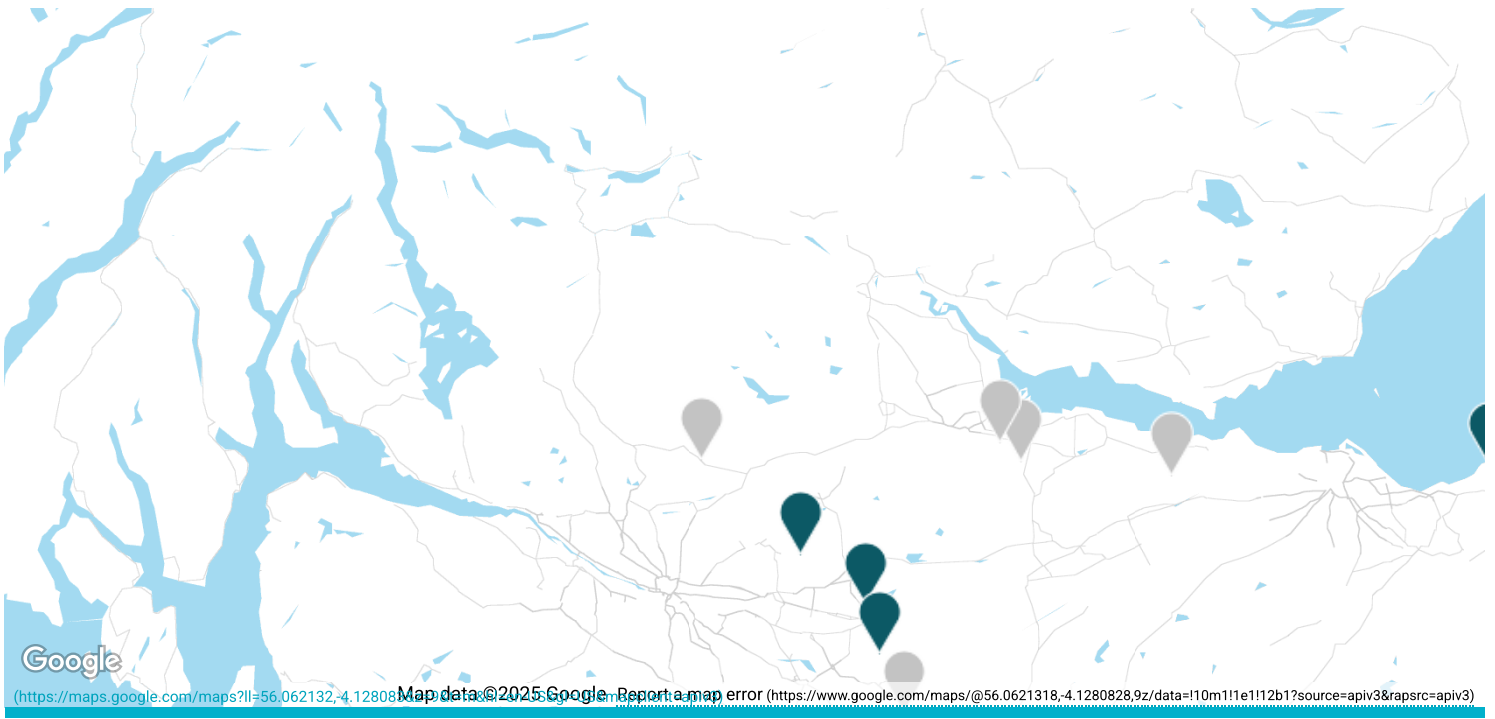




Tayport

Tayport is in Fife and was the one of the former ports for ferries across the Tay estuary linking to Broughtyferry. After the Tay road bridge opened it lost its key role but increased accessibility to Dundee made it a commuter town.

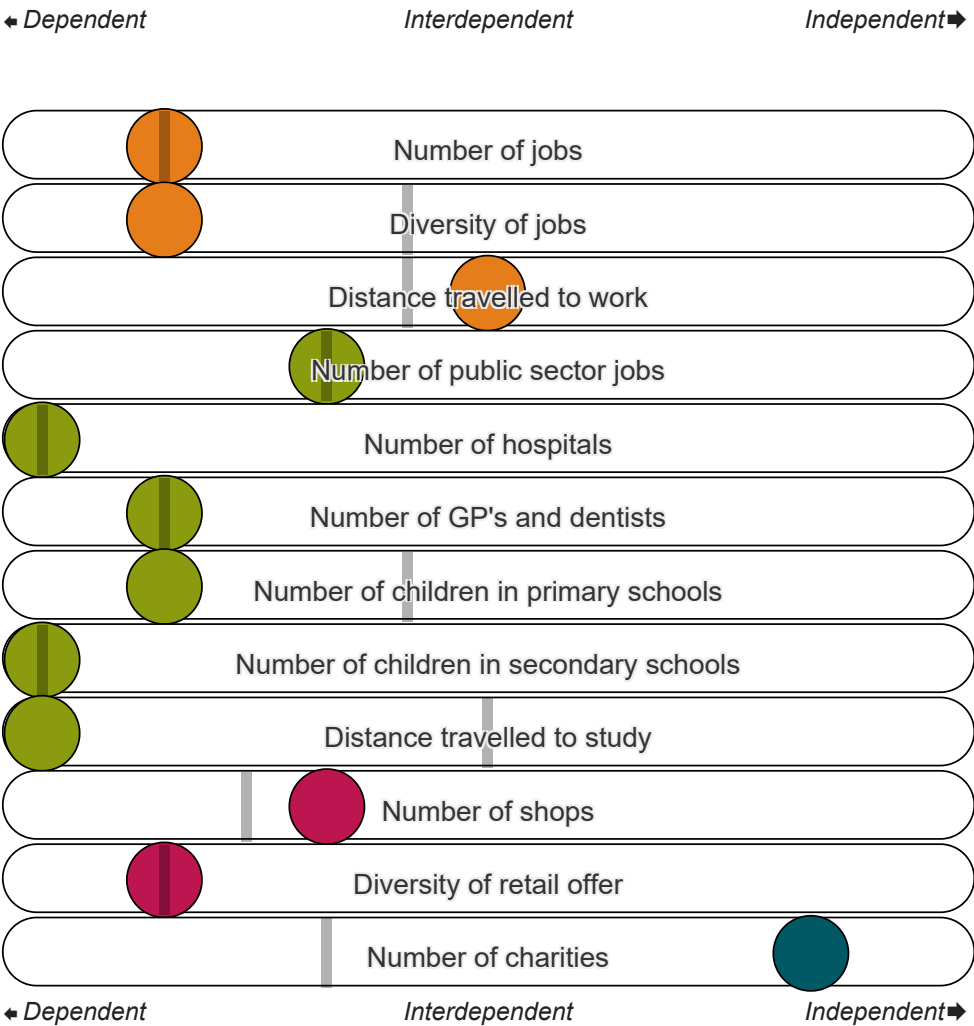
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Tayport is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Tayport is grouped with 10 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and children in primary schools. Tayport differs most from its group in the distance travelled to study.

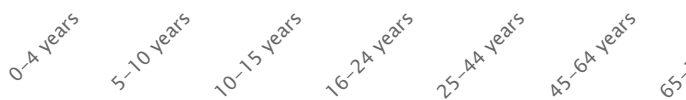

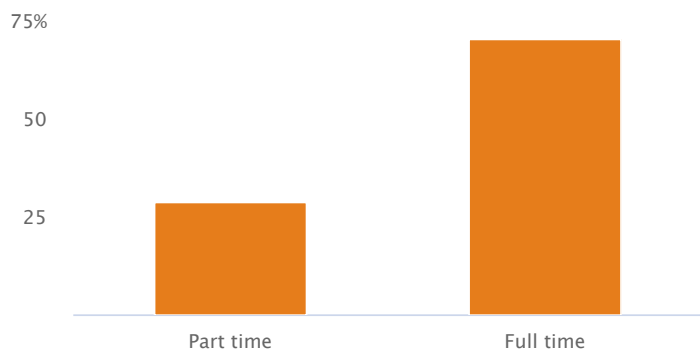

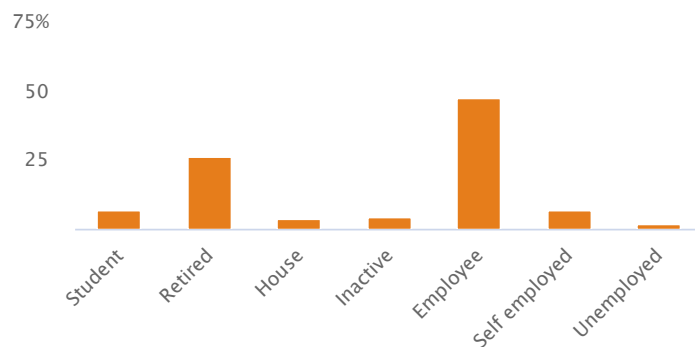
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



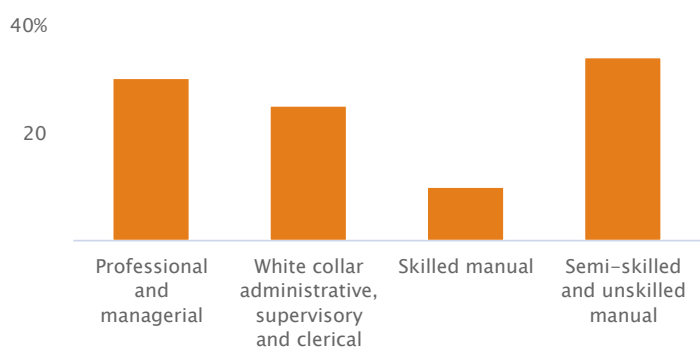
Occupation

Social Grade

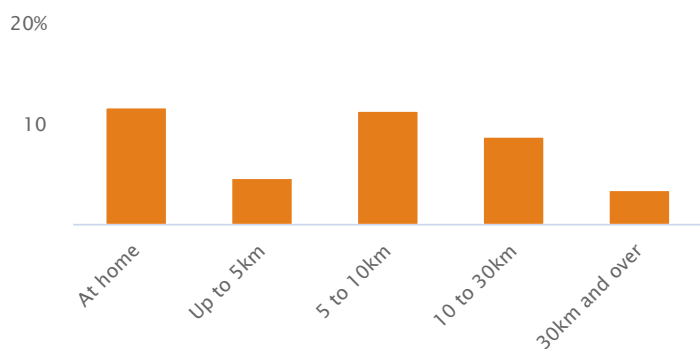
(% households aged 16-64)

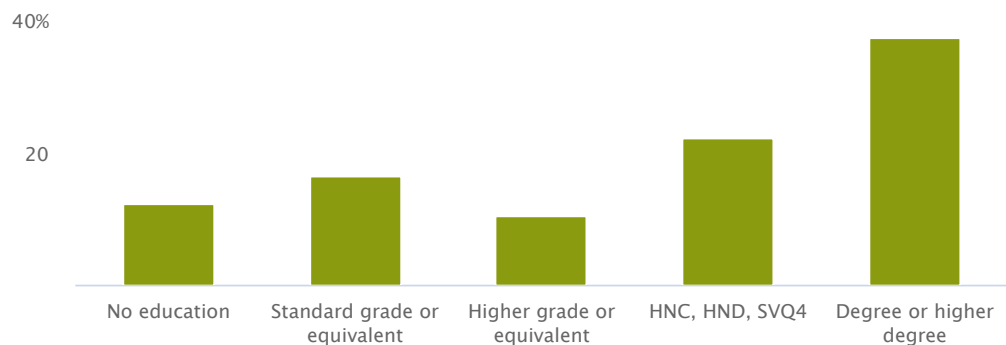


Distance travelled to work

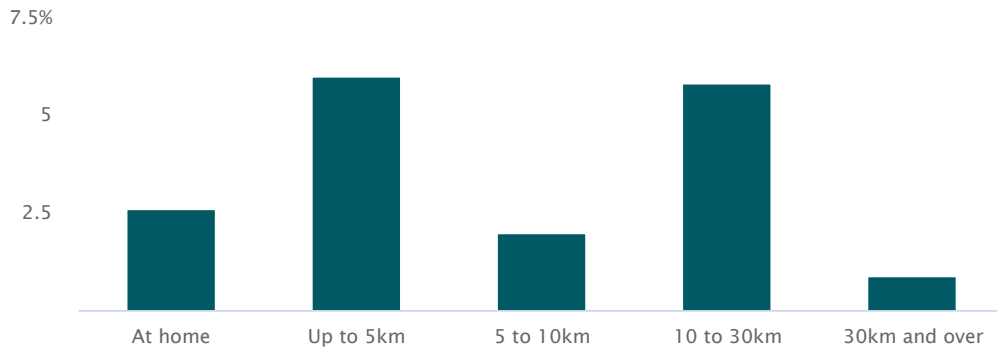
