



Thornhill (Dumfries and Galloway)

DUMFRIES AND GALLOWAY

POPULATION **1,673**

Thornhill in Dumfries and Galloway dates from Roman times. It was located on the main route north from Dumfries. A ferry across the Nith established the town as a staging post in the 1800s with inns and a brewery. It retains its historic layout and hospitality as a tourist centre.

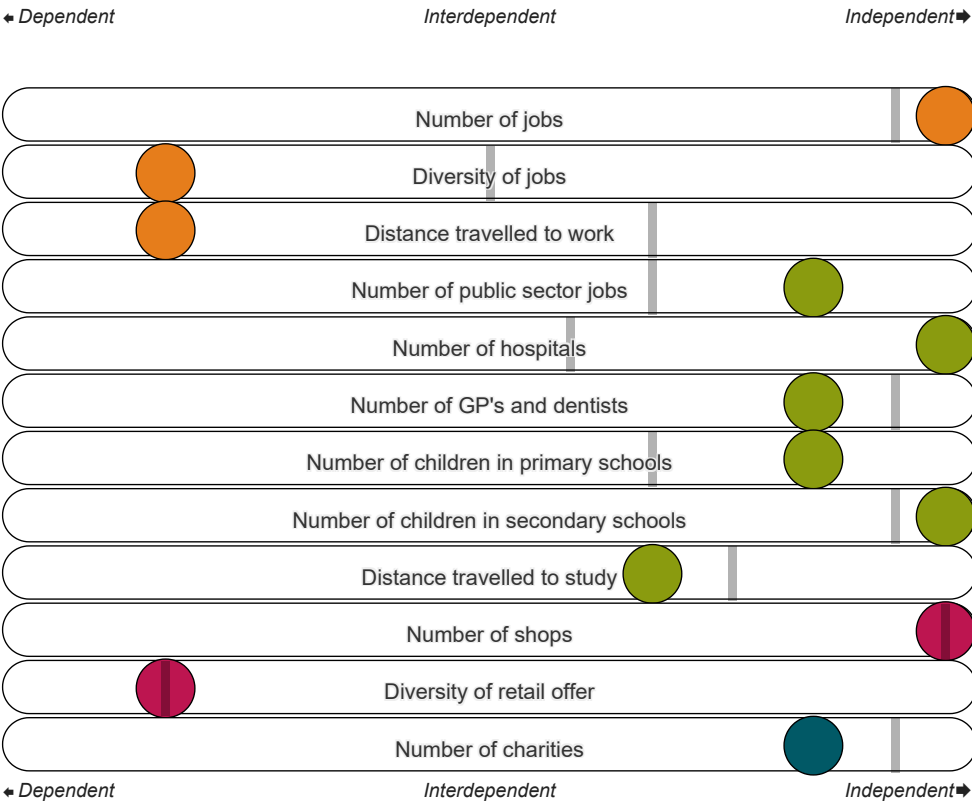
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Thornhill (Dumfries and Galloway) is an independent to interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Aberfeldy](#), [Aberlour](#), [Dornoch](#), and [Grantown-on-Spey](#).

Inter-relationships



Thornhill (Dumfries and Galloway) is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Thornhill (Dumfries and Galloway) is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of hospitals. Thornhill (Dumfries and Galloway) differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

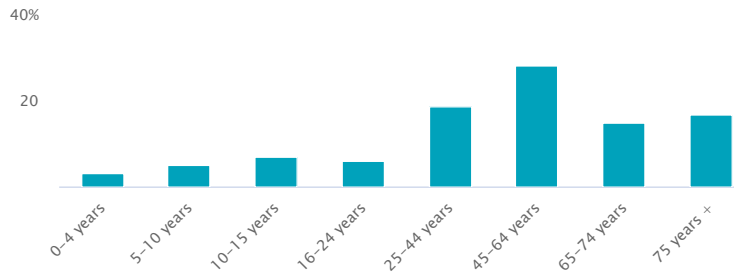
Population change 2011 to 2022

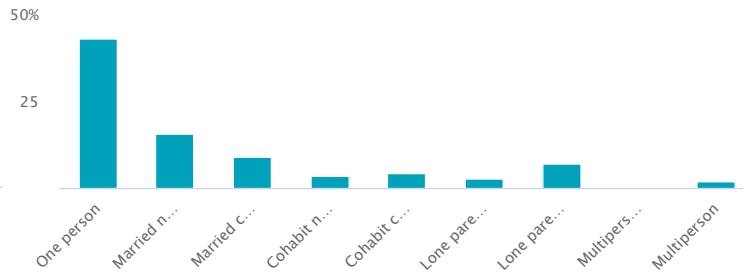

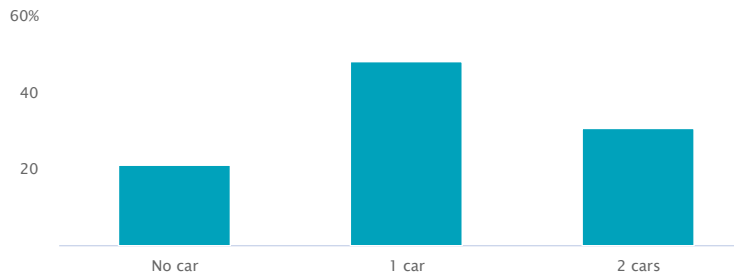

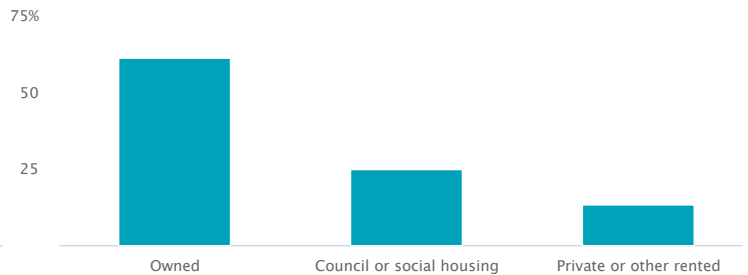
Household composition

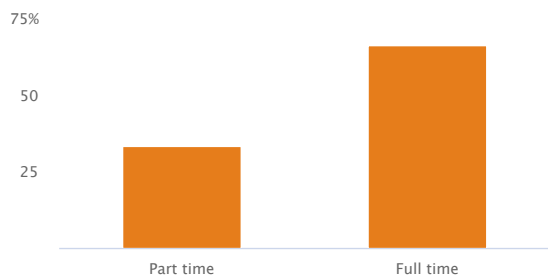

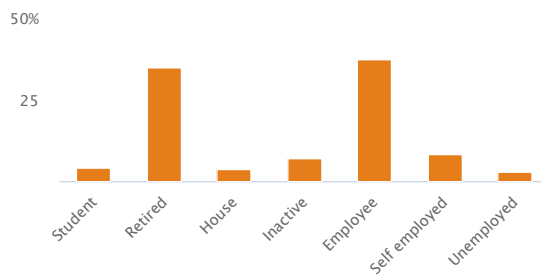
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



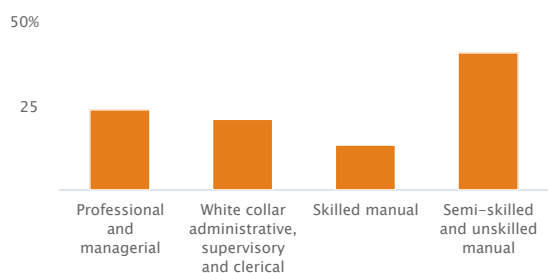
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

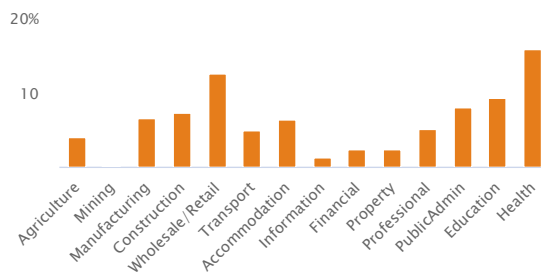

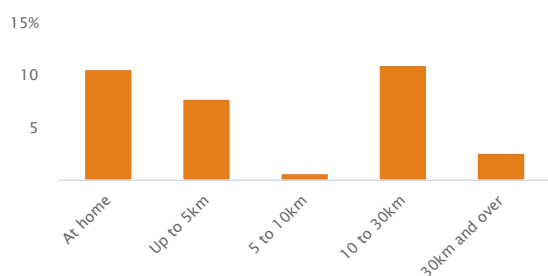
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

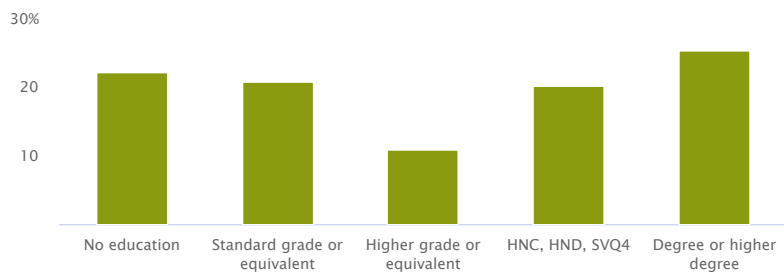


Distance travelled to work

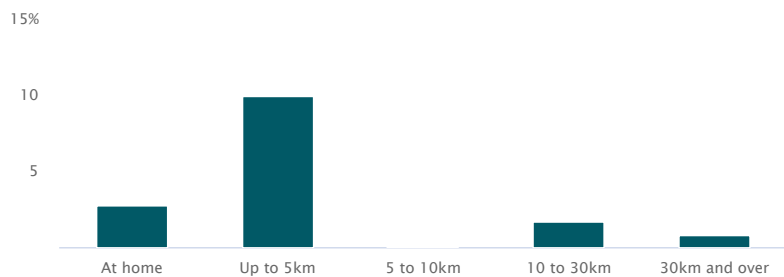
