Tillicoultry is located in Clackmannanshire. A Hillfoots textile town it specialised in blankets, plaids and shawls. It was also home to a paper mill, now redeveloped as Sterling Furniture. It has become a commuter settlement with local services and a small factory outlet park.

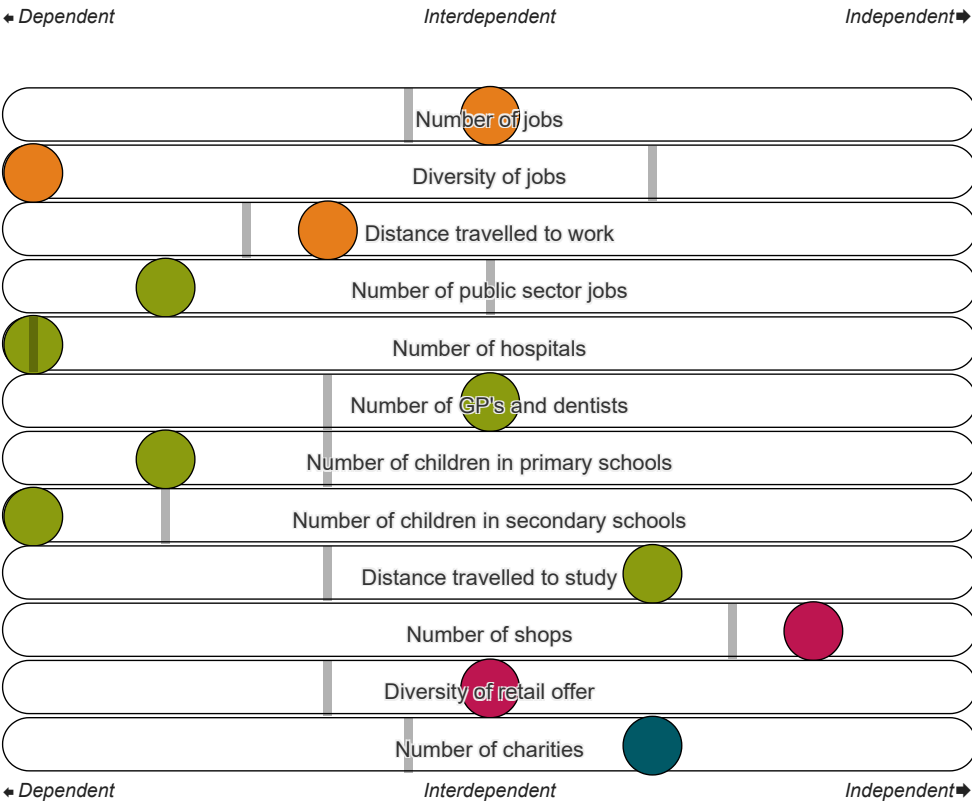
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Tillicoultry is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

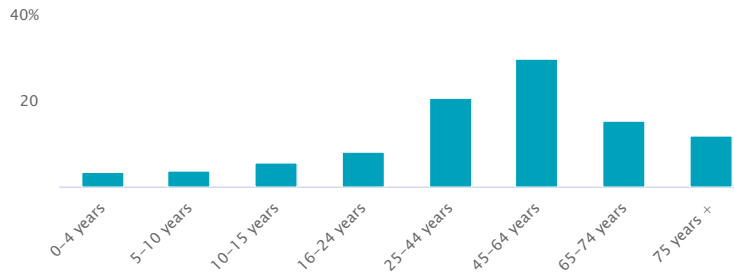

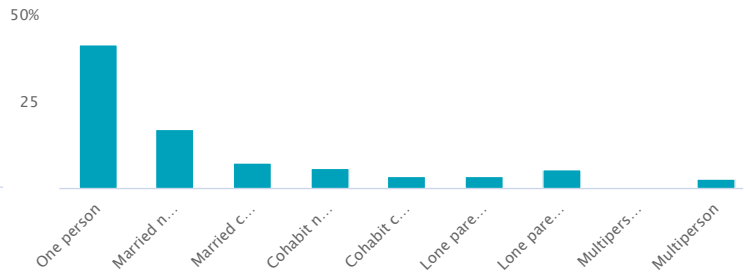

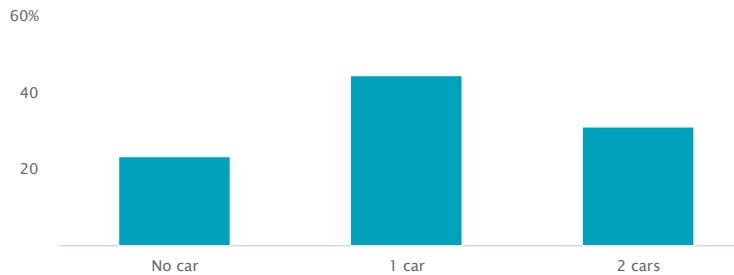

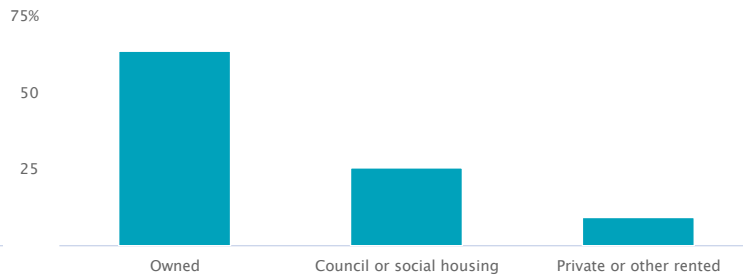
Household composition

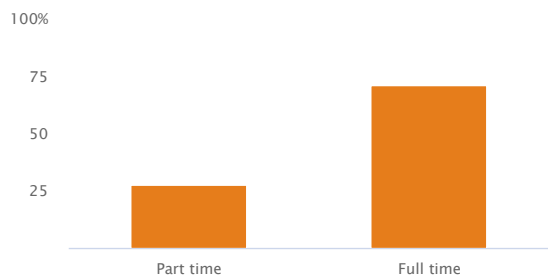

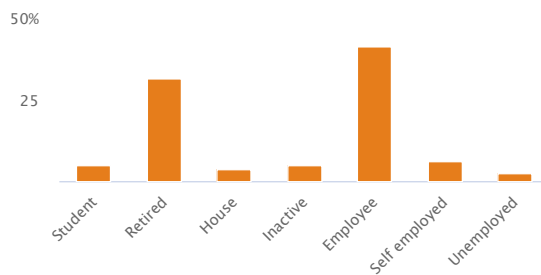
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



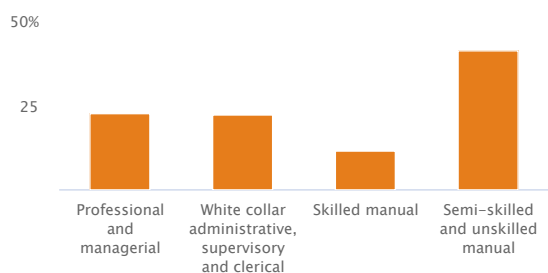
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

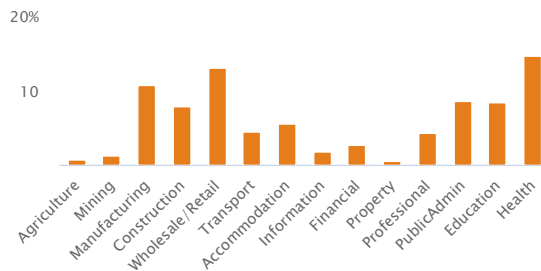


Social Grade

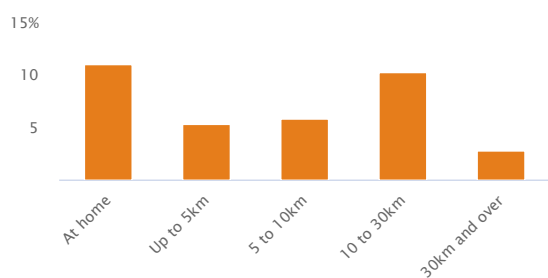
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

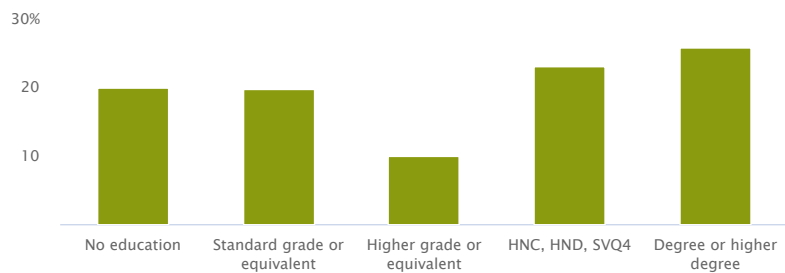


Distance travelled to work

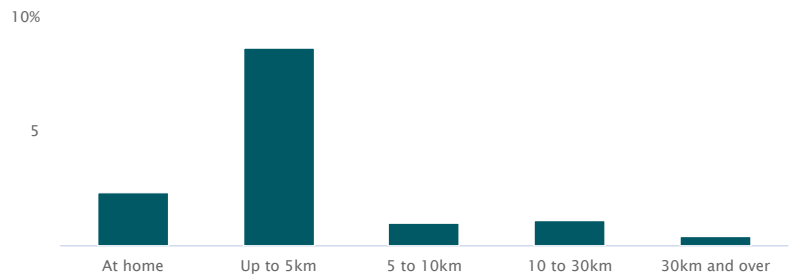
