Tobermory is in Argyll and Bute. Historically it was a fishing harbour designed by Thomas Telford. It is now the major service centre for Mull. Recently some new housing has been built to meet the needs of those working in the area.

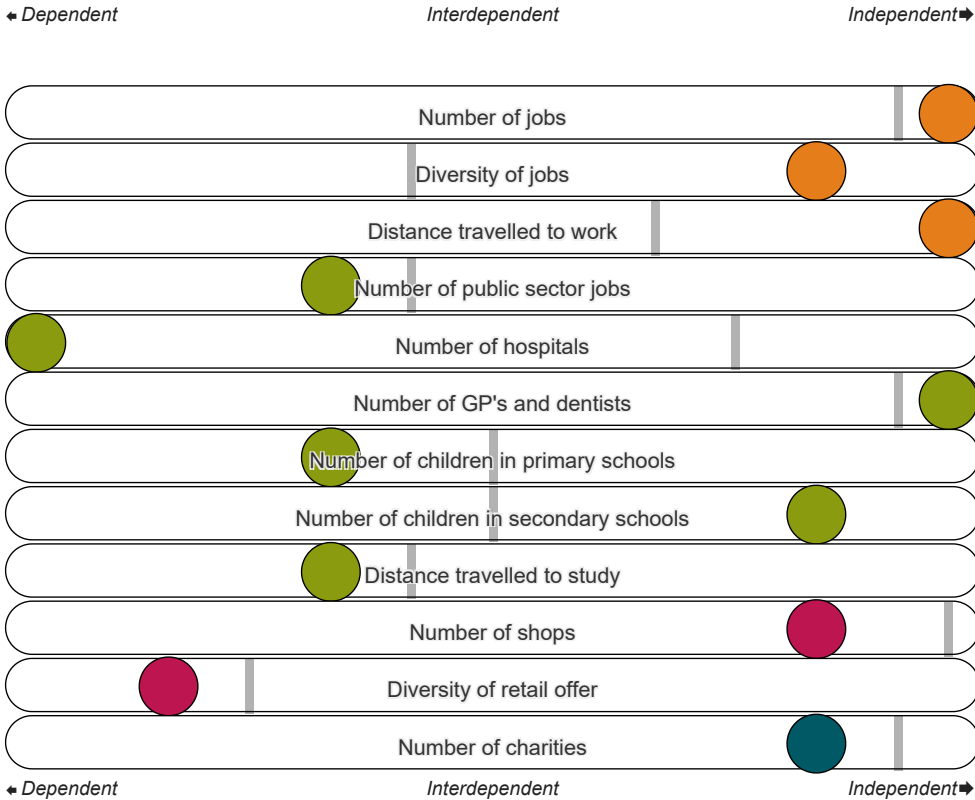
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Tobermory is an interdependent to independent town.

Tobermory is an **interdependent to independent** town.

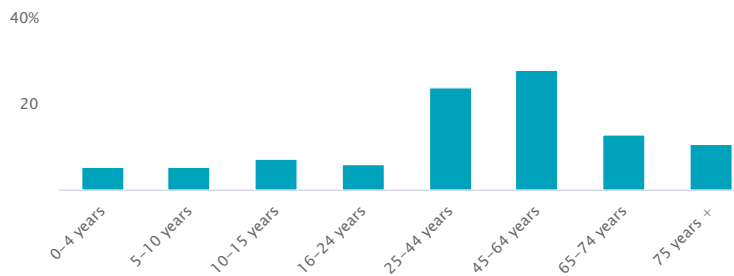
Combining inter-relationships and typology, Tobermory is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in secondary schools. It also differs in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work. Tobermory differs most from its group in the number of hospitals.

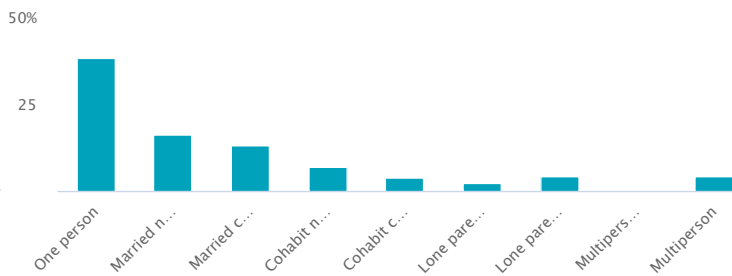

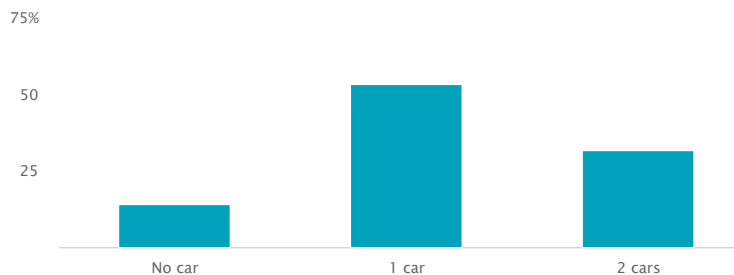

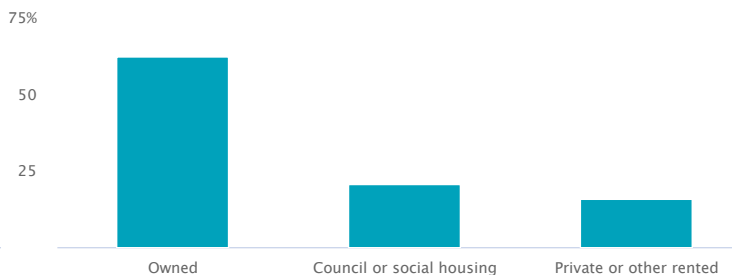
Household composition

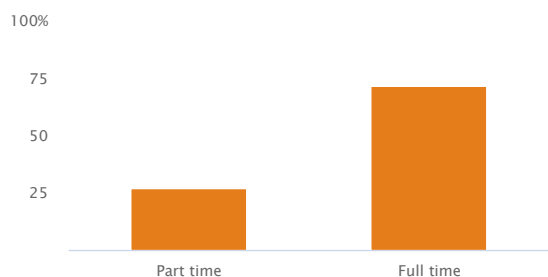

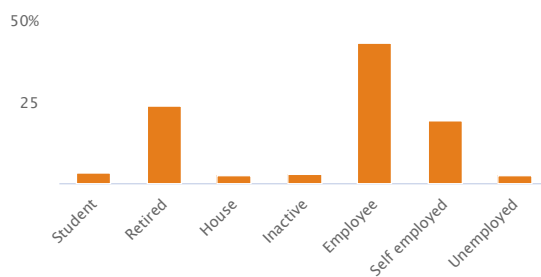
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



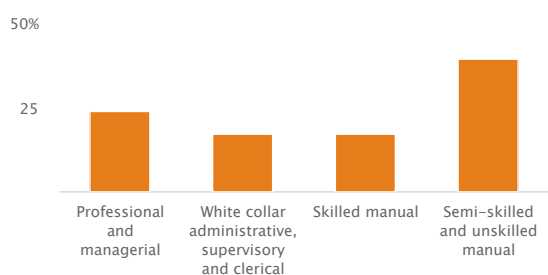
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

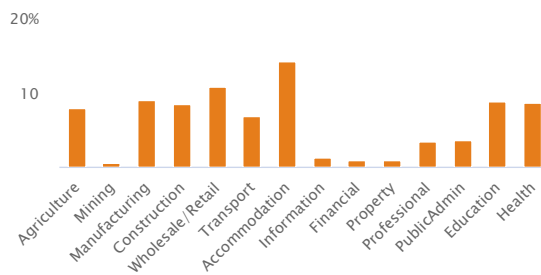

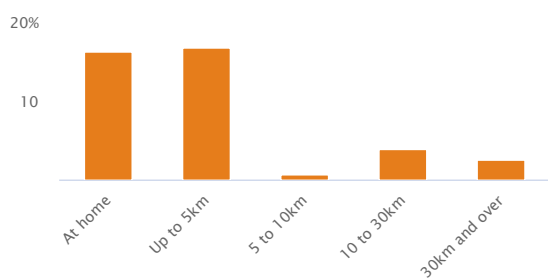
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

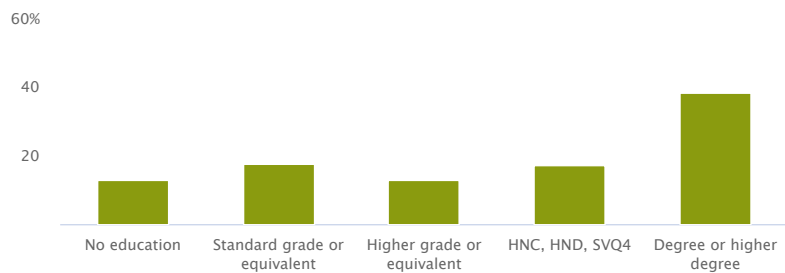


Distance travelled to work

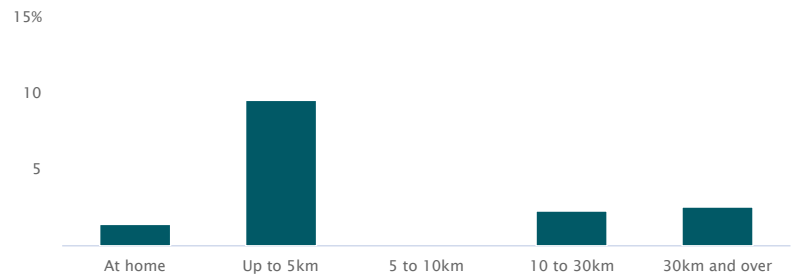
