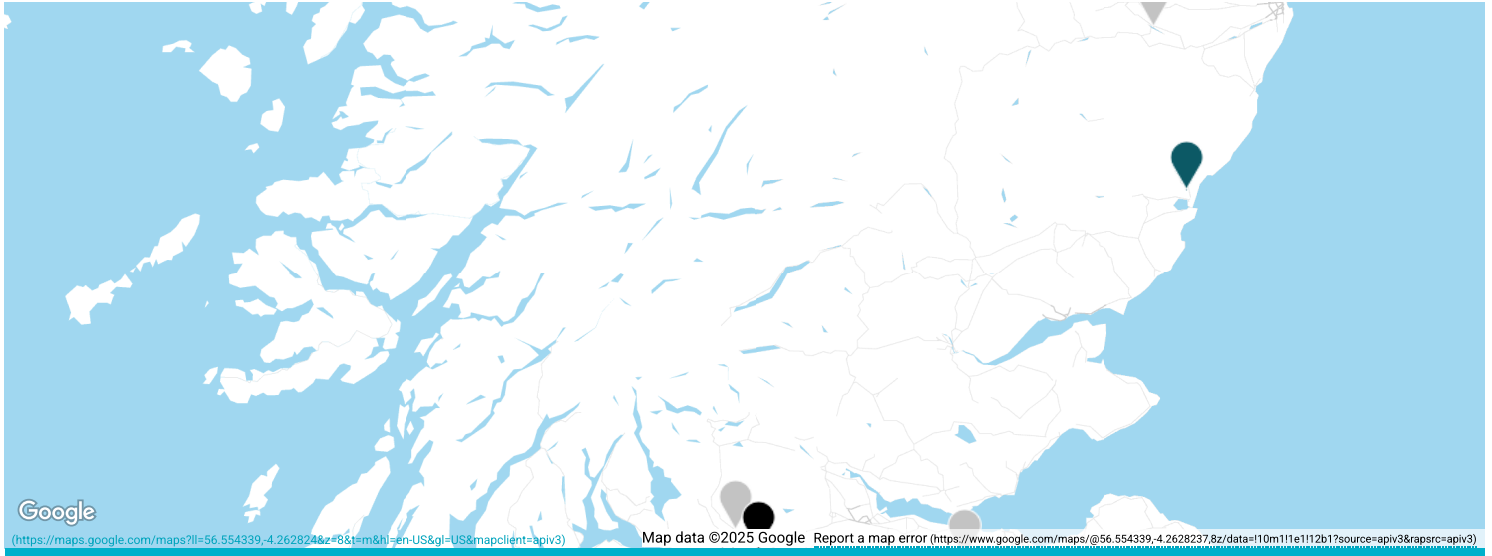




Torrance

EAST DUNBARTONSHIRE

POPULATION **2,325**

Torrance is in East Dunbartonshire. The village was staging post on the rout south from the crossing of the Campsie Fells. Weaving, limestone, mining and ironstone were trades in the 19th century. The current settlement expanded in the late 20th century as a commuter settlement although it has limited services.

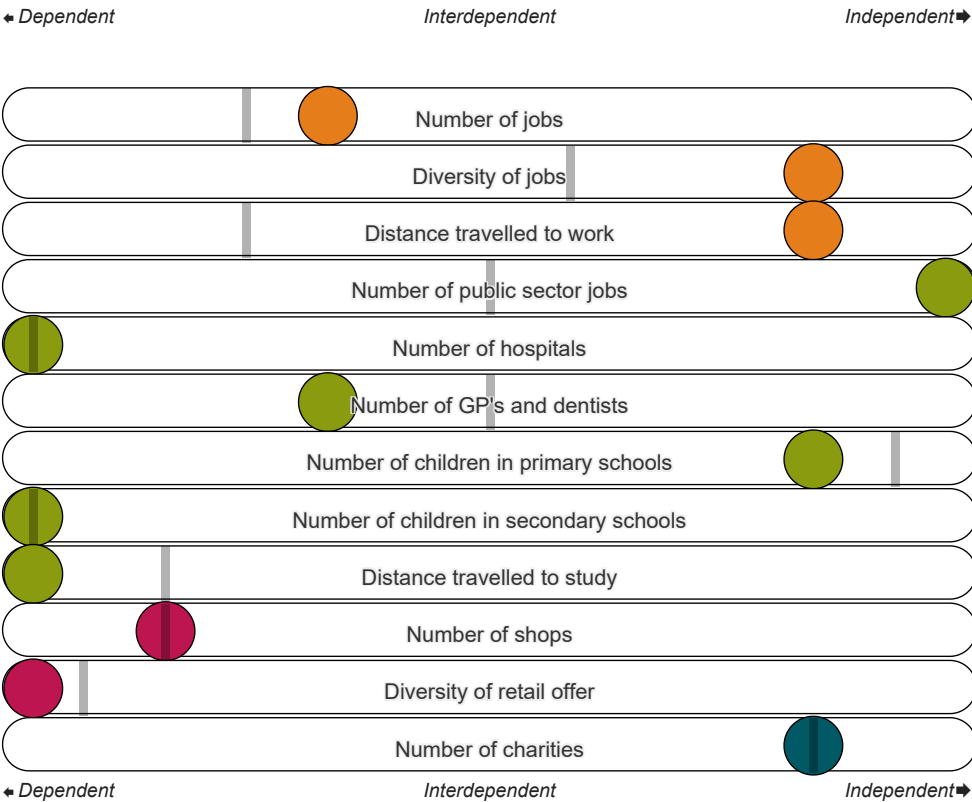
In this small town, this population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

Torrance is an interdependent to dependent town.

Torrance is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Torrance is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. Torrance differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

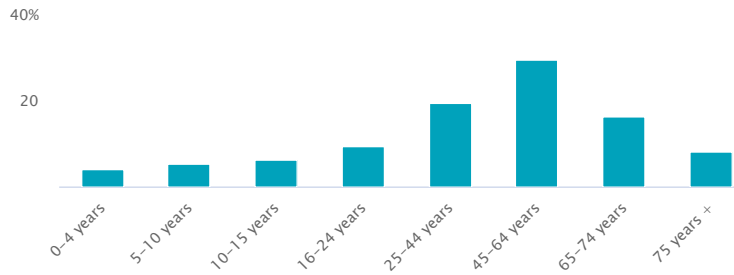

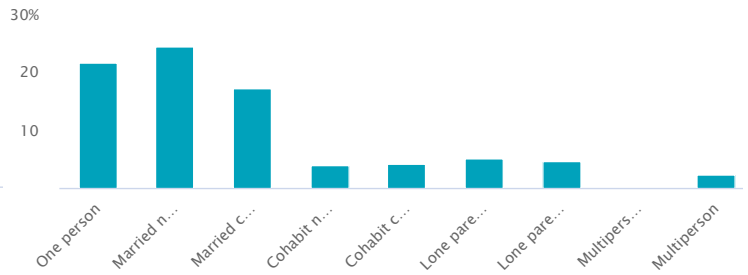

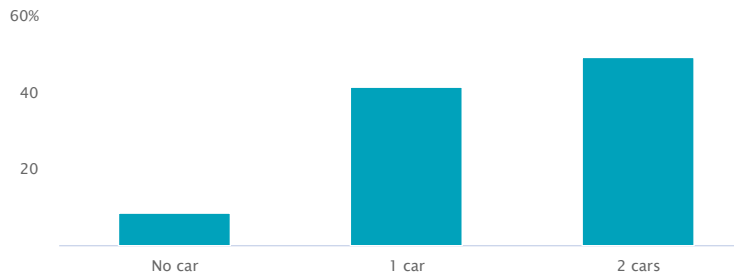

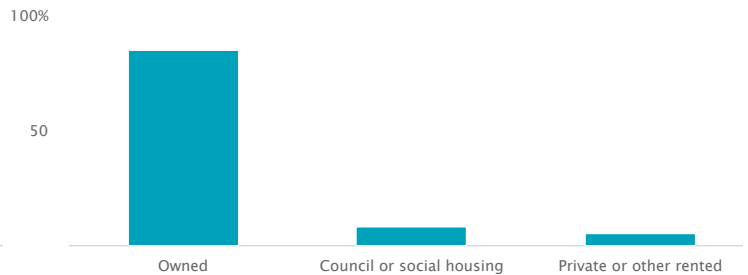
Household composition

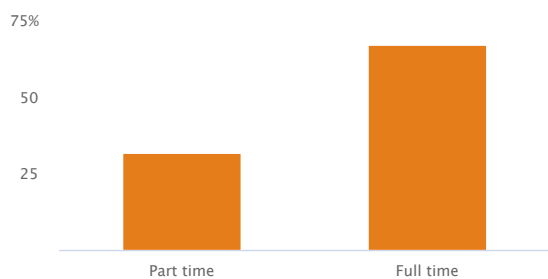

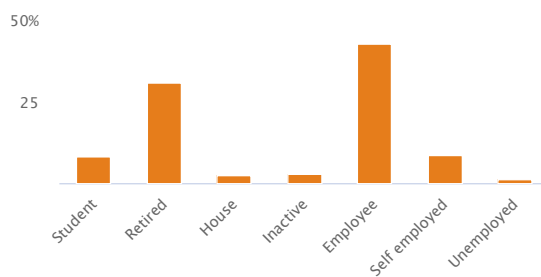
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



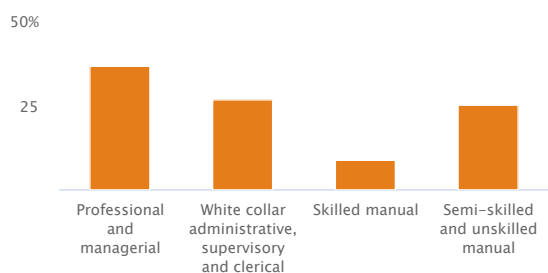
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

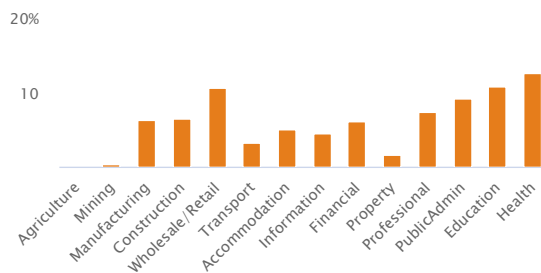


Social Grade

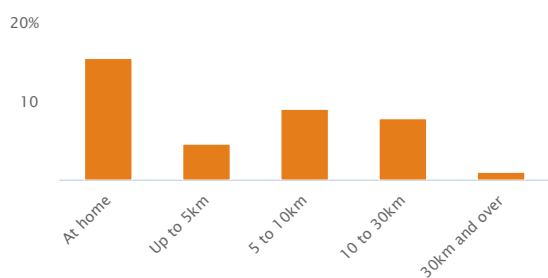
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

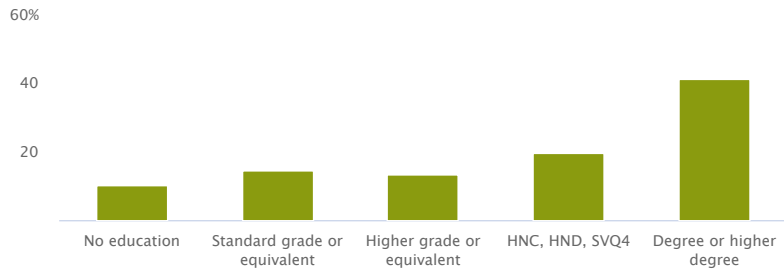


Distance travelled to work

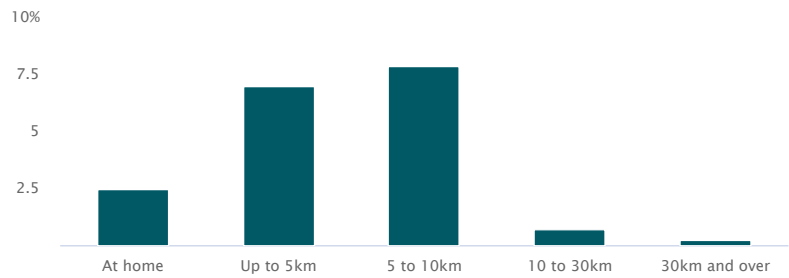
