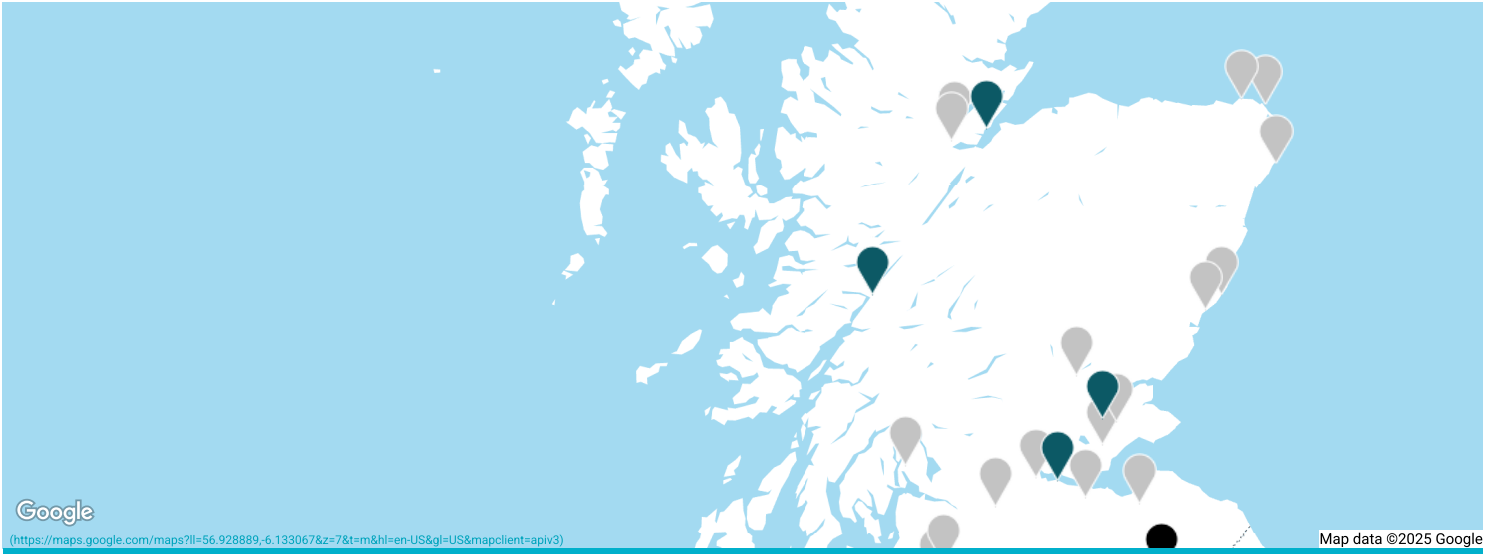




Tweedbank

Tweedbank was formerly part of Galashiels but is now established in its own right as a town. It has extensive industrial parks and housing areas. It is essentially a suburb of Galashiels. The Lowood estate which was put on the market will see further expansion of the town. The recent expansion owes much to its role as the railhead for the Borders Railway.

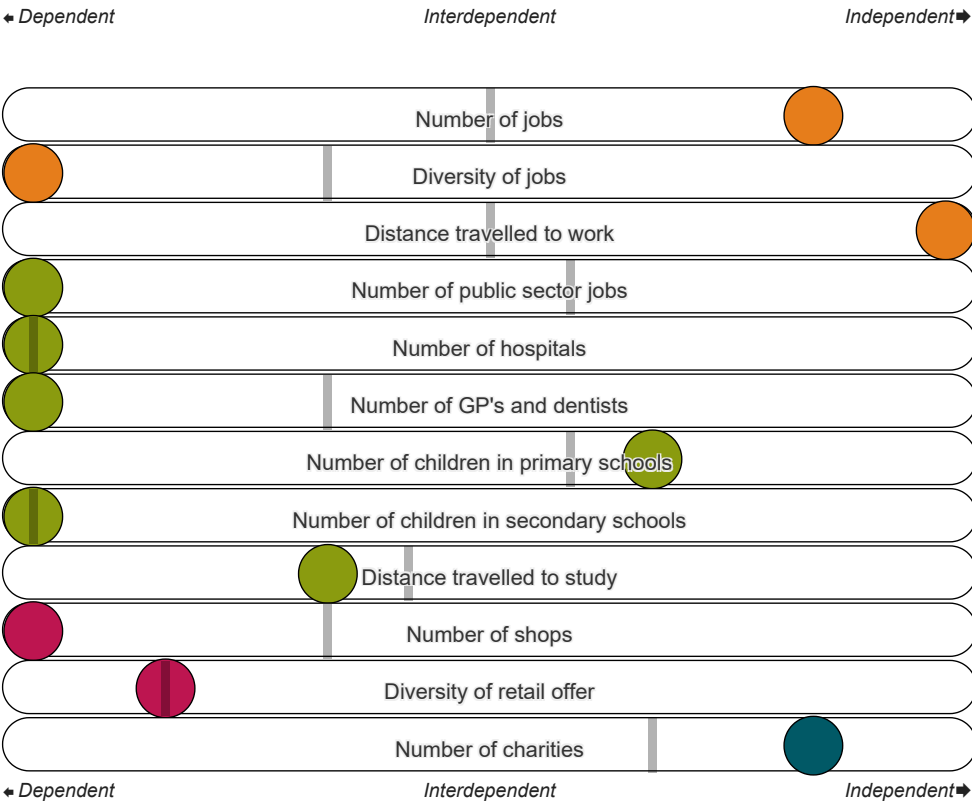
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Tweedbank is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

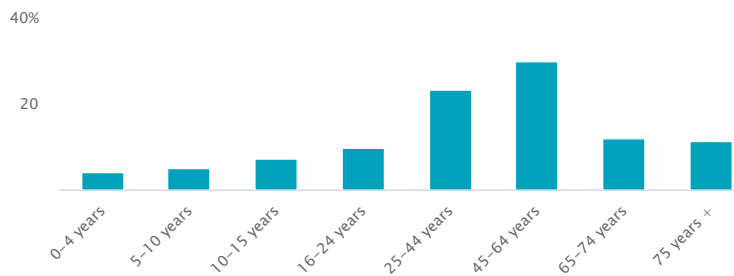
Combining inter-relationships and typology, Tweedbank is grouped with 22 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Tweedbank differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs, shops, and GP's and dentists; and the diversity of jobs.

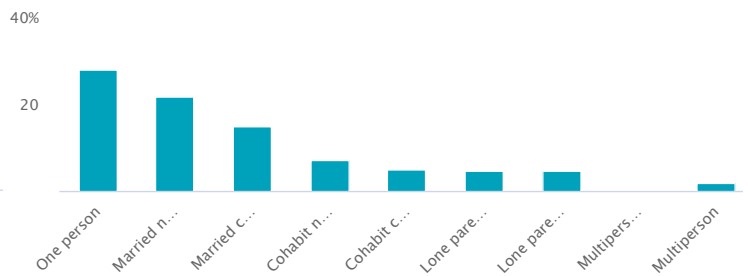

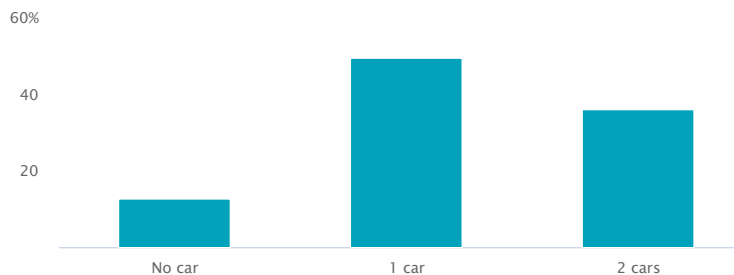

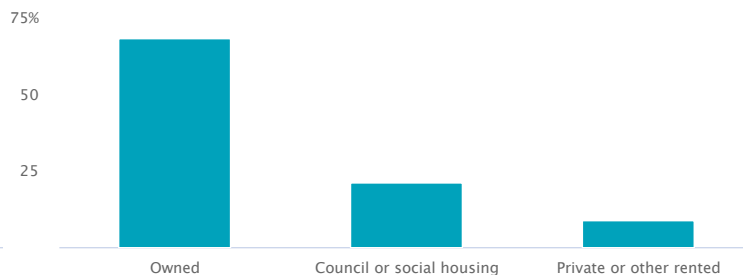
Household composition

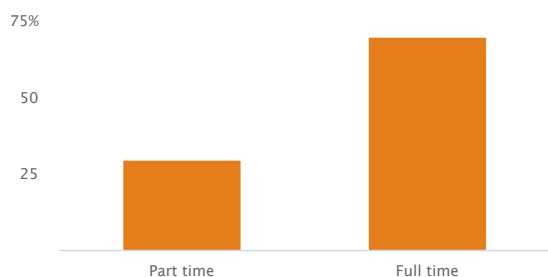

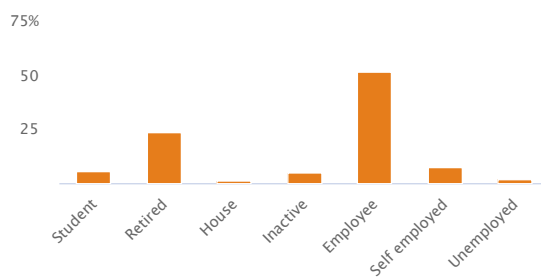
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



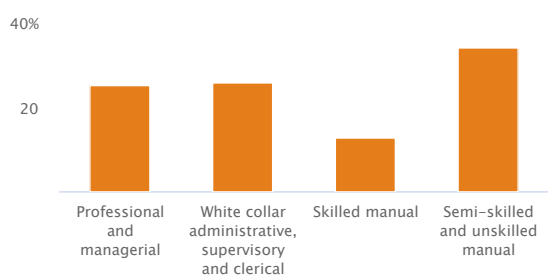
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

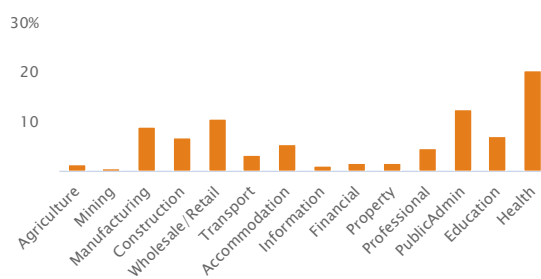

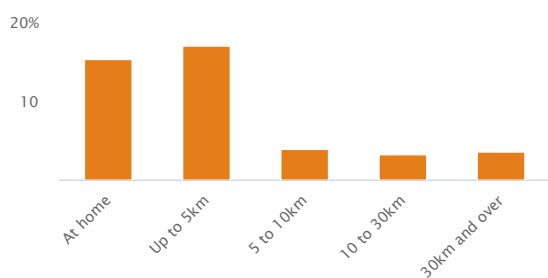
(% households aged 16-64)



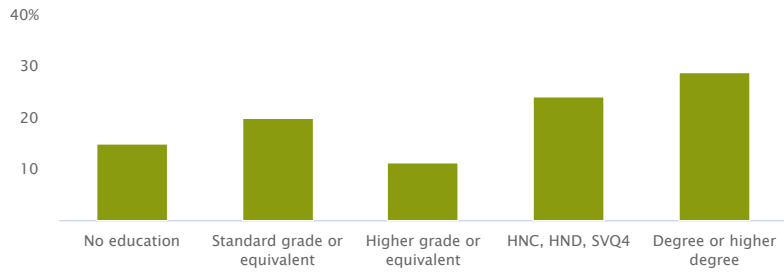
Sector Diversity

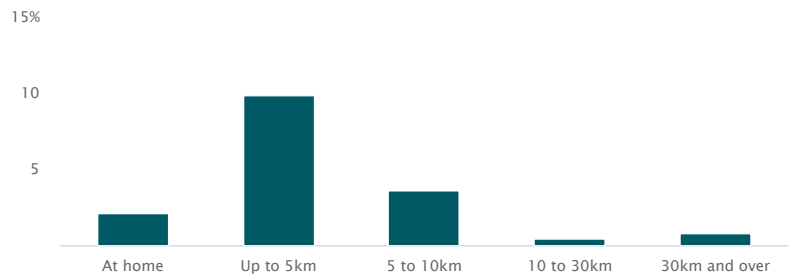
