Ullapool in Highland is a former planned fishing settlement designed by Thomas Telford in the late 18th century. It was an important herring port. In the 20th century it was a very significant factory fishing port. It is a ferry port to the Outer Hebrides and an important tourist and local service centre.

In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Ullapool is an interdependent to independent town.

Its most similar towns are [Aviemore](#), [Dufftown](#), [Golspie](#), and [Langholm](#).



Ullapool is an **interdependent to independent town**.



Combining inter-relationships and typology, Ullapool is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Ullapool differs most from its group in the number of hospitals.












Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)




Occupation

(% aged 16-74)




(% households aged 16-64)




Sector Diversity
