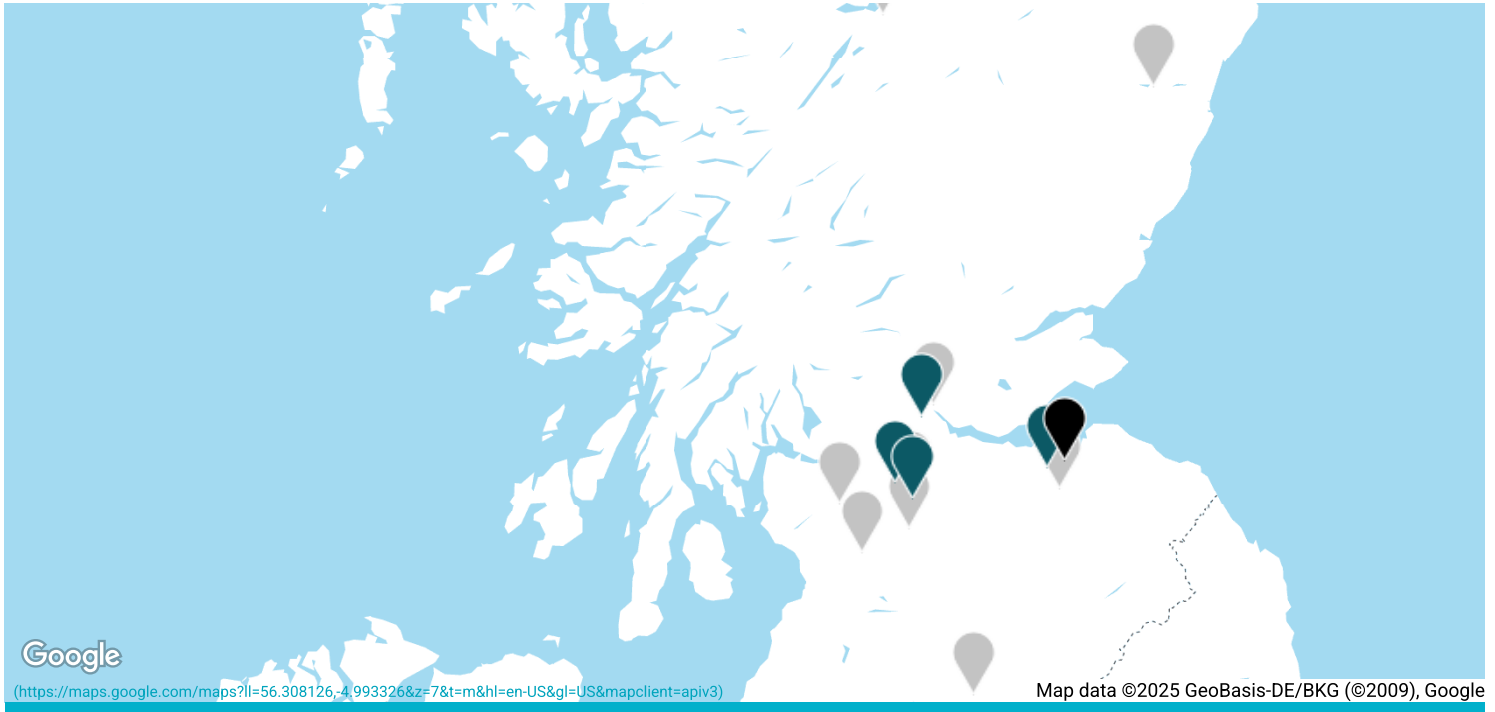




Wallyford

Wallyford is in East Lothian. Like other places in the greater Edinburgh vicinity it is experiencing very rapid development as an emerging new suburban town. New build is everywhere, much of it larger private family homes. A new learning campus and other services are being built. It has a park and ride facility for commuters.

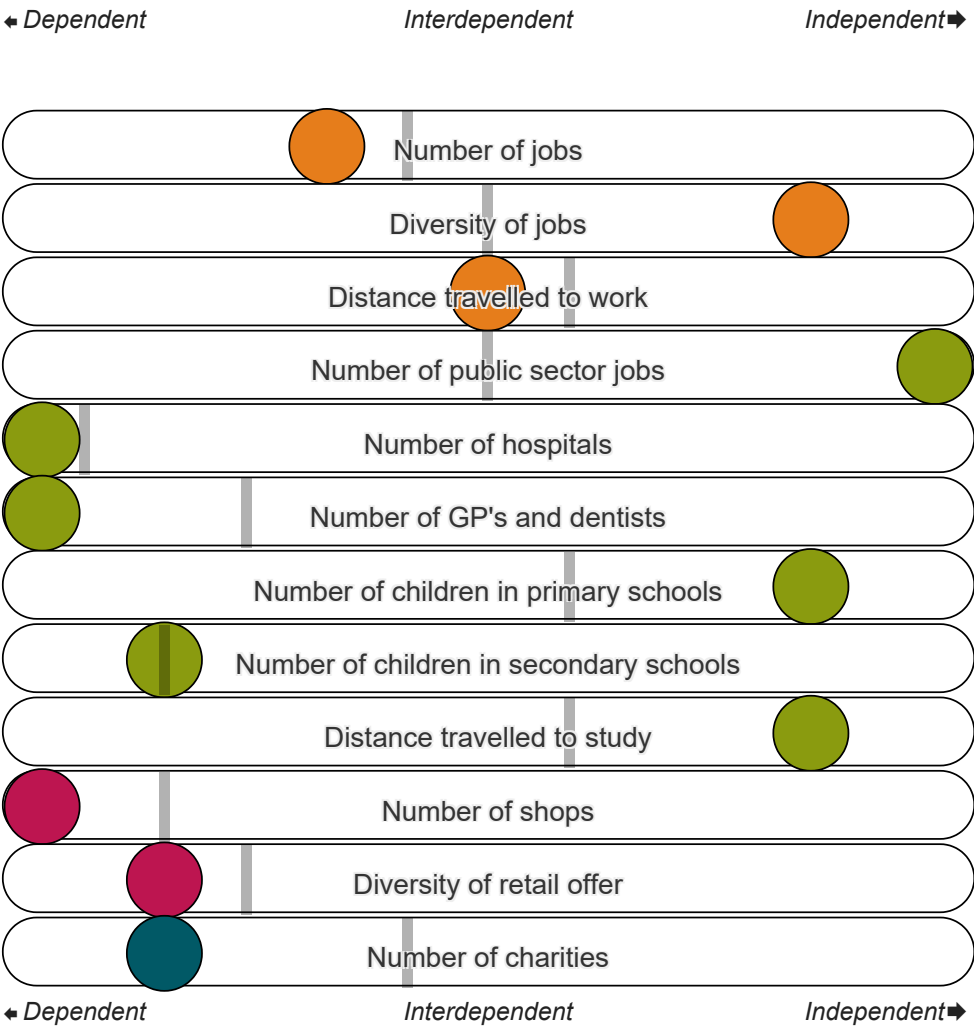
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

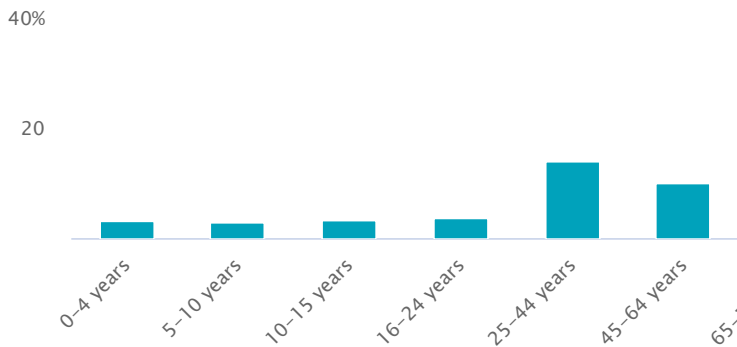
It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. Wallyford differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists.

- Average for the category (Grey vertical line)

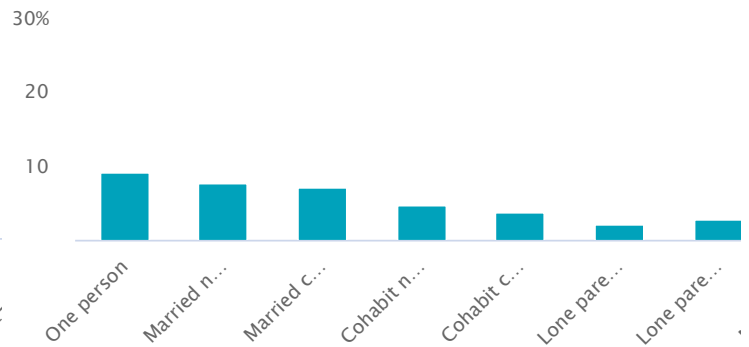

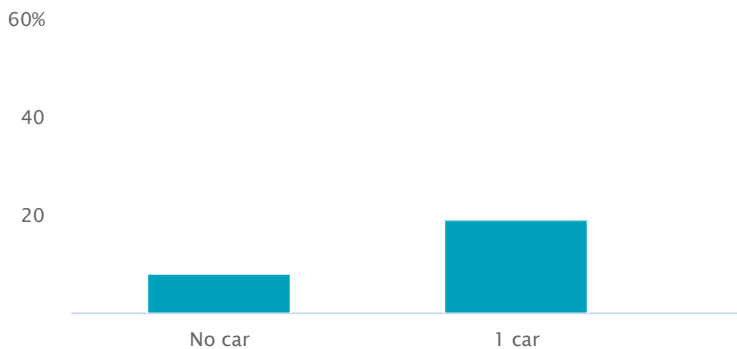

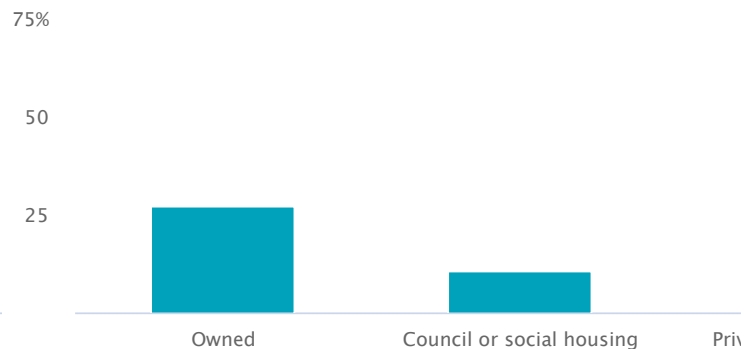
Household composition

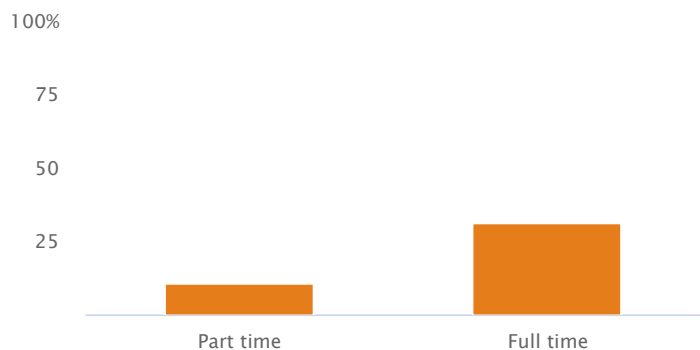

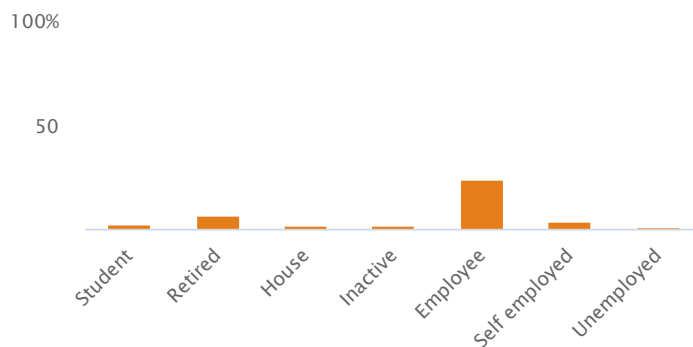
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



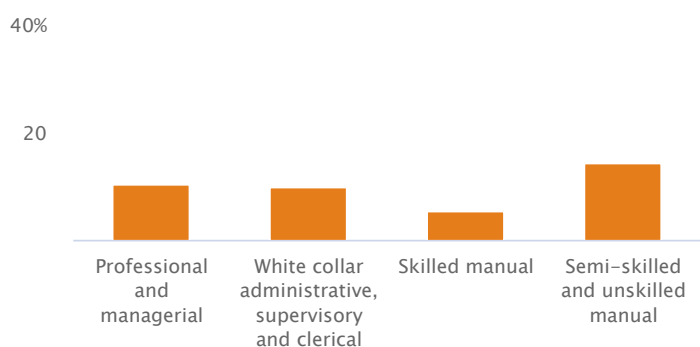
Occupation

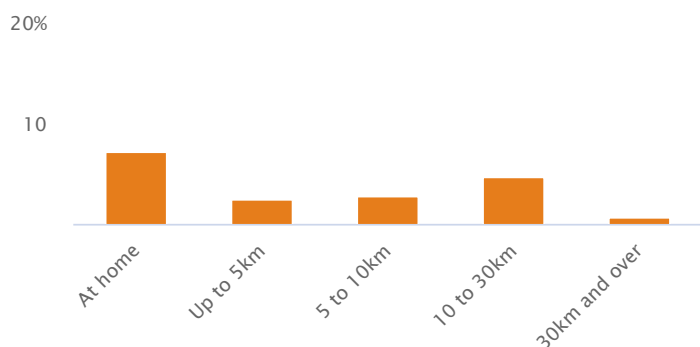
(% households aged 16-64)

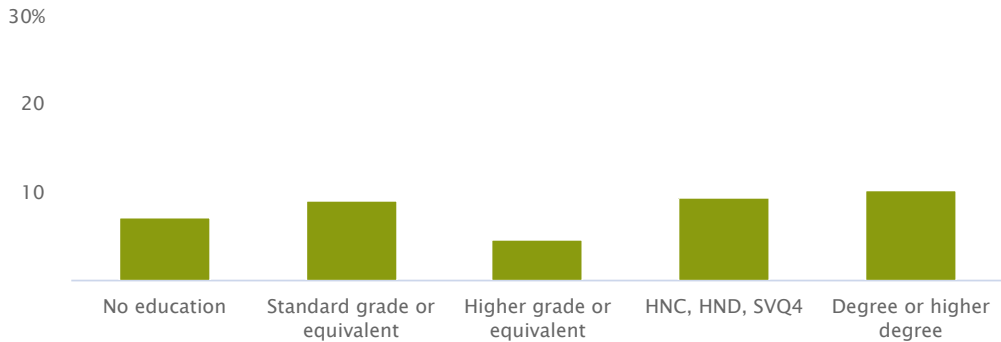


Distance travelled to work

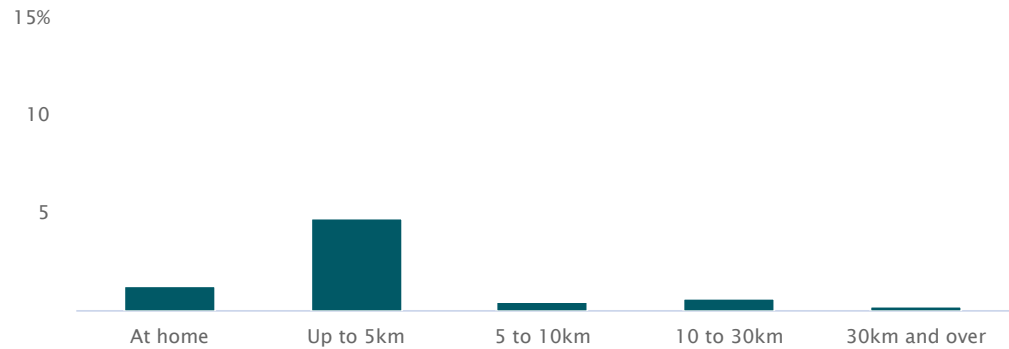
