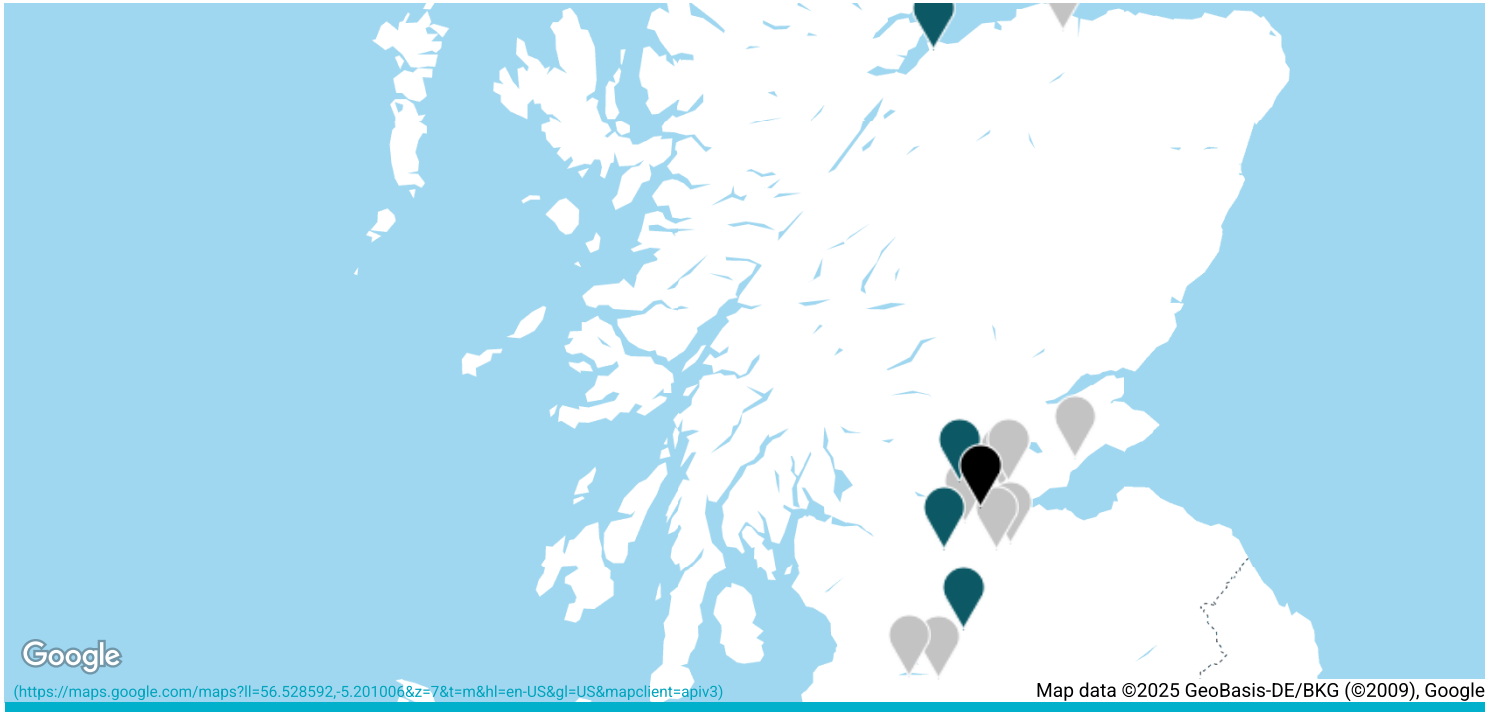




Westquarter

Westquarter is in Falkirk. It is essentially a suburb of Falkirk. It was developed in the 1930s to house miners.

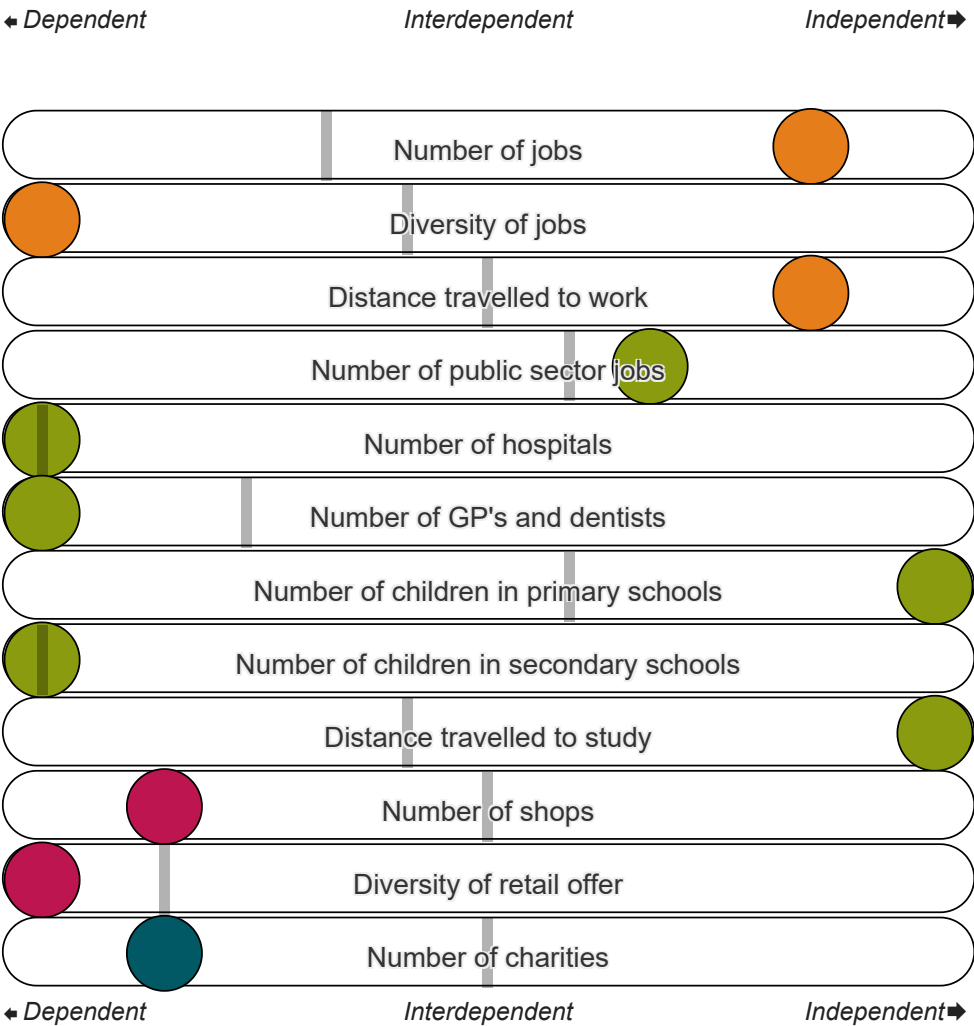
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Westquarter is an interdependent to dependent town.

Westquarter is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Westquarter is grouped with 13 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, jobs, and shops. It also differs in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Westquarter differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

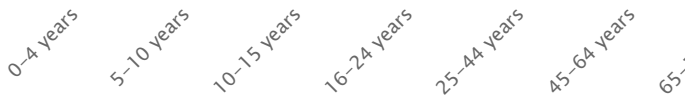

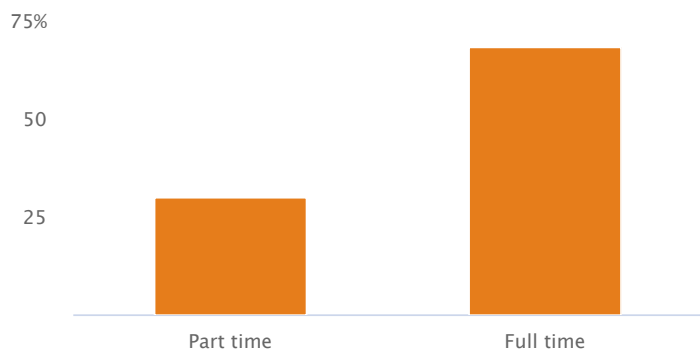

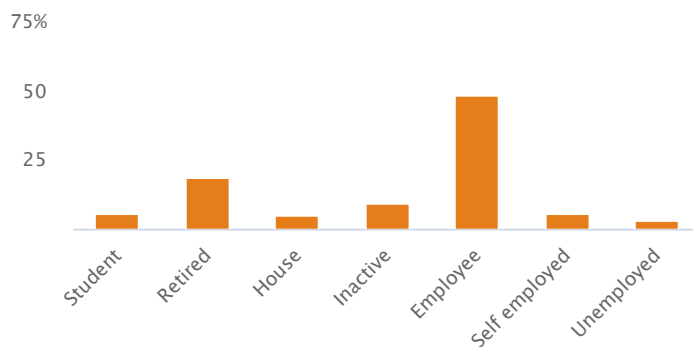
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



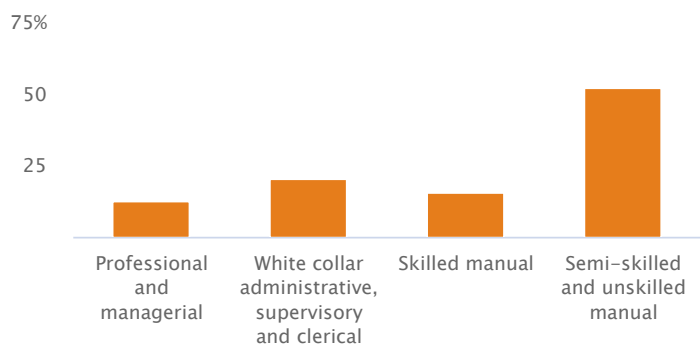
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

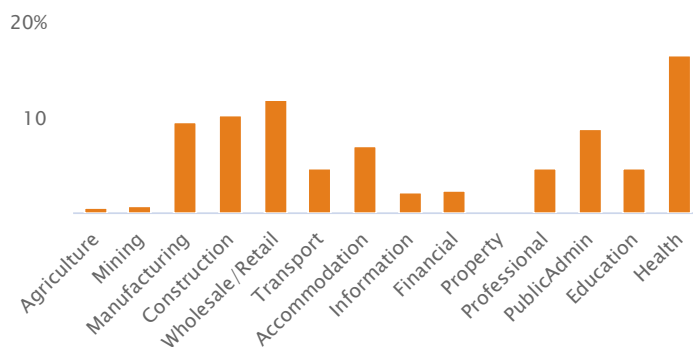


Social Grade

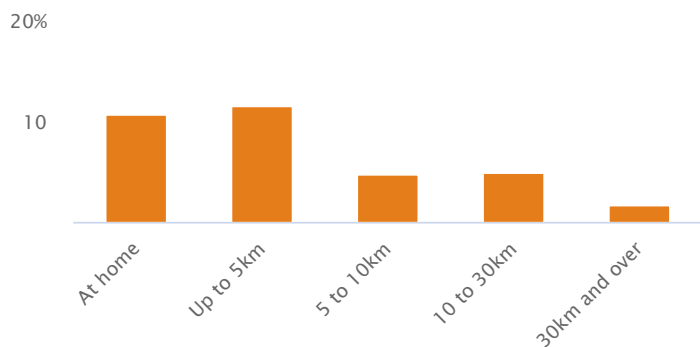
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

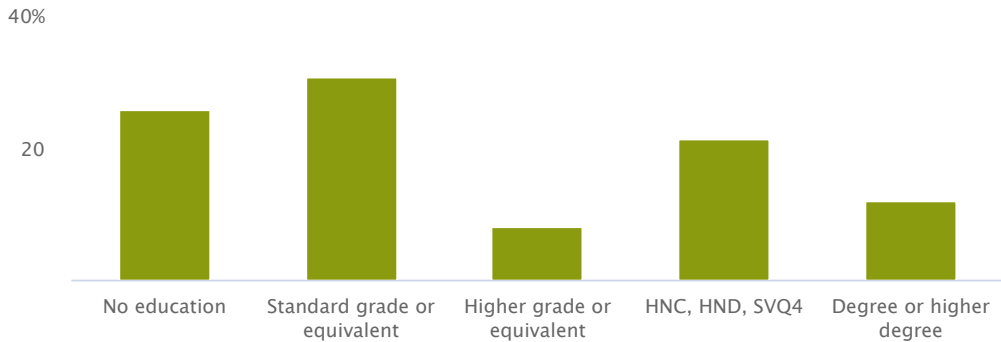


Distance travelled to work

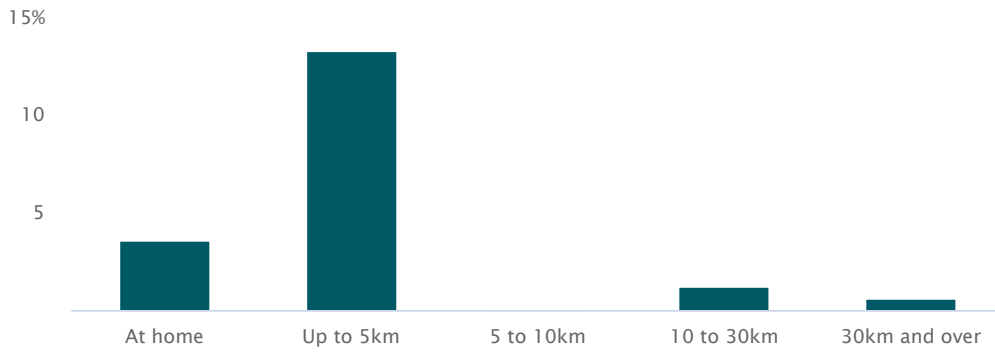
